

Thursday, October 19 & Sunday, October 22 Sermon Notes "Investment"

This Sunday marks the fourth week of Generosity: New Beginnings. The prayer question for this week is "How is the "new thing" God is calling you to a kingdom investment?" and the scripture is Isaiah 43:14-21. I hope you are reading Isaiah 43 and praying about how God can use your prayer, presence, gifts, service, and witness and committing them to the Lord for what is ahead in 2024. If you have not turned in your commitment card, I ask that you continue to pray over the commitment and return your estimate of giving card to the office or in the offering plate by the end of the month. The leadership of the church has been blessed by your response thus far, and your response is helping us to prepare for 2024. A commitment for 2024 is not just a commitment for the year ahead, but it is also an investment. Many who heard the prophets' words would not live to see the prophecy fulfilled. Isaiah was a long tenured prophet, and it would take time for his prophecy to be realized. Yet, Isaiah spoke a message which would bring hope to the current generations and generations to come. 



First United Methodist Church of Gadsden During the month of October we will be offering training for First UMC Gadsden's Safe Sanctuaries Policy. Everyone in our church should be concerned about Safe Sanctuaries. <u>Safe Sanctuary</u>, <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 1</u>, <u>4:30 pm in the Senior High Room</u>, <u>211</u> and 6:30 pm, Room 209.

What is Safe Sanctuaries? The Safe Sanctuary Policy puts in place rules and guidelines for our church family as a whole and the church staff

and volunteers for ministry with children, youth and vulnerable adults. This policy is important because it protects our children and youth under the age of 19 and vulnerable adults! While the policy has a lot of specifics for various aspects of nursery care, Children's Ministry and Youth Activities, it is important to remember these three rules for all church activities, events, practices, and meetings of any kind: 1) There must be two unrelated adults present. 2) Volunteers in ministry with these groups must be active in the church for at least 6 months before taking a leadership role. 3) Volunteers in leadership roles must be at least 5 years older than the age group that they are working with. Thank you for helping us keep our most precious gifts safe!


LINDA CLEVELAND
