
Thursday, October 26 & Sunday, October 29 Sermon *Notes: "A Matter of Worship"*

We are at the end of our journey through Isaiah 43. While the entire chapter has been a message of hope and new beginnings, Isaiah concludes the chapter with a word about what got the Israelites in the predicament that they were experiencing. He says that instead of bringing the Lord, God honoring sacrifices that they only brought him their sins and iniquities. The Lord will forgive them for their lack of worship and keep His promises. Isaiah reminds them that it is not God who wronged Israel, but Israel who was disobedient by not properly worshipping God.

Paul writes in Romans 12:1, That we are to present ourselves as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is our spiritual worship. Worship is not simply a noun or a time when we show up once a week. Our worship is how we show up and present our best to God. The Israelites failed to honor God with proper worship. How are we doing in worshipping with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness? I pray you consider your worship as you look to your commitment to First United Methodist Church in 2024.





Everyone in our church should be concerned about Safe Sanctuaries. Safe Sanctuary, Wednesday, November 1, 4:30 pm in the Senior High Room, 211 and 6:30 pm, Room 209.

What is Safe Sanctuaries? The Safe Sanctuary Policy puts in place rules and guidelines for our church family as a whole and the church staff

and volunteers for ministry with children, youth and vulnerable adults. This policy is important because it protects our children and youth under the age of 19 and vulnerable adults! While the policy has a lot of specifics for various aspects of nursery care, Children's Ministry and Youth Activities, it is important to remember these three rules for all church activities, events, practices, and meetings of any kind: 1) There must be two unrelated adults present. 2) Volunteers in ministry with these groups must be active in the church for at least 6 months before taking a leadership role. 3) Volunteers in leadership roles must be at least 5 years older than the age group that they are working with. Thank you for helping us keep our most precious gifts safe!






TED & MARIE JOHNSON
