"Not Far From the Kingdom" 10.31.21

This guy was a scribe (who was also a Pharisee). This challenger liked the way that Jesus had handled the previous challenger – a Sadducee. Here was the challenge: "Hey, Jesus. Which is the greatest commandment?" This wouldn't have been a weird question to ask. The scribes had determined that the Jews were obligated to obey 613 precepts of the Law – 365 negative ("thou shalt nots") and 248 positive ("thou shalts"). One of the favorite hobbies of the scribes was to sit around and discuss which of the 613 precepts was the greatest one. So, not a strange question. And Jesus didn't give a strange response...at least at first. Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 6: 4-5, the great confession of faith that pious Jews (even today) recite each morning and evening. It is called, "The Shema." Shema is the first word of the confession. It means "hear." "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." Right on target, Jesus! But then...Jesus adds another quote – this one from Leviticus 19: 18. "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The scribe

We read in Mark 12: 28-34 where a "challenger" came up to Jesus to test him.

Then Jesus said this: "You are not far from the kingdom of God." Hmmm. What does it mean to be *close* to the kingdom of God? Maybe it means that such a person is facing the truth honestly, and not just defending the "party line" or confirming their own previous biases. Maybe it means that such a person has

agrees with Jesus. He says, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he

is one, and besides him there is no other'; and 'to love him with all the hearts, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself,' - this is much more important than all whole burnt

the courage to stand up for what is right even if their friends disagree.
But is "close" to the kingdom of God good enough? This is what we will talk about Sunday in the Traditions service.



10.31.21 Celebration Sermon Notes

Sermon Notes, Kryptonite Sometimes we hear Bible stories at VBS or Sunday School but do not hear about them when we are adults. This is one of those stories that you remember but have not heard in a long time. Sunday we finish our Rocktober Series, and the Praise Band is playing the song Kryptonite. Delilah was Samson's kryptonite. Do you remember Samson? He couldn't have his hair cut or he would lose his strength. He was a mighty warrior but could not resist the temptation of letting Delilah trick him. Here are four points that we will talk about this Sunday. God uses imperfect people. Even before Samson was tricked by Delilah, he made some huge mistakes. God uses each one of us despite our past and future mistakes. Delilah was Samson's kryptonite. What is yours? Let us recognize what things cause us to stumble the most in life. How can we guard ourselves from letting kryptonite get the best of us? Obedience – Samson had a weird instruction to not cut his hair. It was a strange rule, but the story teaches us to trust and obey. Let us not forget where our strength, knowledge, abilities, etc come from. Samson does not have superpowers without God. He cannot win these battles on his own.

The scripture for Sunday is Judges 16:4-22 Samson and Delilah

Join us as we remember members of our church family and loved ones who have passed away during the past year. This remembrance will take place in both worship services.


