### From Pastor Anne:

As I write this note, it is Wednesday, March 27th and we are in the midst of Holy Week. Tomorrow begins the *Triduum*, the Three Days (measured in the old way, from sunset to sunset) that form the central mystery of the Christian Faith. On Maundy Thursday we remember Christ's last meal with his friends. On Good Friday we remember his death on the cross, and of course on Easter Sunday we celebrate his resurrection from the dead. These are the events without which nothing else in our faith really matters. As I said to the Church Council at our last meeting: the world makes a big deal out of Christmas, but we Christians know that without Easter, Christmas is just some guy's birthday.

It is, of course, even more essential than that. If Christ's resurrection were *the only* resurrection, then really why would we care? "It's all very well for *him*," we would say, "but he's left *everybody else* just as mortal as ever!" But in fact that is not true. We believe that Jesus's resurrection was just the beginning, just a foreshadowing, an *amuse-bouche* if you will, of a resurrection that all of us will one day experience. As St. Paul said, "Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died." He's the "first fruits", but we in our own time will be the harvest. Death itself has been defeated. Alleluia.

### What's up with the...

... big white candle next to the baptismal font?

Several of you have asked me about the big white candle next to the baptismal font, so here is a little explainer. When I very first arrived here at MUMC, I did what I always do in a new church: I went through the closets & cupboards & storage rooms to see what I could see. One of the things that I found was the lovely purple leather-bound lectionary book that I read the gospel

lesson out of every Sunday. What a find! It appears to be a legacy from the (now sadly closed) United Methodist Church in Deland. Another thing that I found was the big white candle. It was stored in a metal shelving unit along with a large number of other candles and various other worship accoutrement, but it caught my eye right away because you don't often see this particular kind of candle in a United Methodist church. Usually it's only our Roman Catholic, Episcopalian, and Lutheran brothers & sisters who have them

This particular kind of big, white candle is called a Paschal Candle, and it is meant to call our attention to the fact that all of us have been united to the death & resurrection of Christ by virtue of our baptism. We light it on Easter Morning to signify the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. It will burn through all the 50 days of Easter right up until the festival of Pentecost. We also light it every time we baptize someone, for every funeral that we hold in the church, and on All Saint's Day. Right now, we have the candle that I found in the metal cupboard, sitting on a plate, on top of a side table, but this Easter we will consecrate a new Paschal Candle and stand purchased as a memorial.

If there are no applicants planning on entering the ministry, the O'Dell Scholarship Fund can make awards to students in the fields of nursing, teaching, social work, or health care.
