From Pastor Anne:

At this time of year, when the sun rises late and sets early, many people fall into a bit of a funk due to the lack of light in our lives. For some people the funk is severe, and is called "Seasonal Affective Disorder." We are often told by our doctors to spend at least twenty minutes per day sitting under very bright lights in order to treat the disorder. You would be amazed how much this simple exposure to light can improve the lives of suffering people. Other folks don't get depressed every winter, but they're feeling down this winter because of some aspect of their lives: the loss of a job, or of a dream, or of a loved one. Some people (maybe you!) are feeling down and they don't even know why.

And that's just how life is. Sometimes we are feeling down while the rest of the world moves on around us. But during the Christmas season it is particularly hard to take. The whole world, it seems, is decking the halls and making with the merry, and fa la la la, and we try to smile and play along but deep down inside we are weeping. If that sounds familiar, The Blue Christmas service is for you.

On Sunday, December 21st (the longest night of the year,) we will gather together with our friends from Cisco United Methodist Church for a joint Blue Christmas Service. We will acknowledge our sadness, our grief, and the hardship that the holidays can bring, we will lift them up to God, and we will hold each other close in prayer. Outreach News

There is only one miracle that is recorded in all four of the Gospels, and that is the miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fishes. Well - that miracle was re-enacted right here in Piatt County last month. It all started with the gentlemen of the Knights Of Columbus (a fraternal organization for Roman Catholic men.) They decided to make a donation of \$500 to the Piatt County Ecumenical Food Pantry, hosted at our church. The director of the Food Pantry, Jean Holmes, asked the store manager at County Market, Anna Shipley, how we could best turn this generous donation into food for hungry people. Anna then consulted with the manager of the meat department, and later called Jean to let her know that they would happily turn money into hamburger for us.

Friends - when Jim Holmes went to get the hamburger, they nearly filled up his truck. In the same way that Jesus made five loaves of bread and two fish into enough food to feed 5,000 people, the County Market managers turned the already-generous donation from the Knights of Columbus into 600 pounds of hamburger for distribution at the Food Pantry.

Youth Ministry News


It is hard to believe that it is almost time to say goodbye to 2025. We have had a great year in Youth Group and it will only continue to get better come this spring and summer of 2026.

There will be no Sunday school after the program on the 21st. Sunday school will resume January 11th. Happy Holidays!


Fun & Fellowship News
