From Pastor Anne:

Several of you have asked me about the big white candle next to the baptismal font, and the first Sunday in November, All Saints Day, is one of the occasions upon which we light it, so here is a little explainer. When I very first arrived here at MUMC, I did what I always do in a new church: I went through the closets & cupboards & storage rooms to see what I could see. One of the things that I found was the lovely purple leather-bound lectionary book that I read the gospel lesson out of every Sunday. What a find! It appears to be a legacy from the (now sadly closed) United Methodist Church in Deland. Another thing that I found was a big white candle. It was stored in a metal shelving unit along with a large number of other candles and various other worship accouterments, but it caught my eye right away because you don't often see this particular kind of candle in a United Methodist church. Usually it's only our Roman Catholic, Episcopalian, and Lutheran brothers & sisters who have them

This particular kind of big, white candle is called a Paschal Candle, and it is meant to call our attention to the fact that all of us have been united to the death & resurrection of Christ by virtue of our baptism. We light it on Easter Morning to signify the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. It will burn through all the 50 days of Easter right up until the festival of Pentecost. We also light it every time we baptize someone, for every funeral that we hold in the church, and on All Saint's Day. None of the standard issue liturgical books says to light it on the festival of The Baptism of the Lord (first Sunday after Epiphany) but I do anyway because I think it's appropriate and the books don't know everything. The candle that I found in the metal cupboard isn't the one that currently stands at the front of the Sanctuary, by the way. Our current Paschal Candle was purchased in memory of several members of our congregation in 2023.

Giving Trees

The Outreach Committee has chosen the recipients of our 2025 Giving Tree Missions. We will collect for "K9s for Warriors" and "Hope on 5th", Lincoln, IL.

• "K9s For Warriors is the nation's largest Veteran service organization focused on providing highly trained Service Dogs to Warriors with invisible wounds of war. Our program is focused on mitigating the debilitating symptoms of service-connected traumas. We validate our methods through tireless research and make breakthroughs every day. Successfully guiding a Veteran through the K9s For Warriors program and providing them with a Service Dog doesn't just change the Warrior's life. It saves it.

The majority of our K9s are rescues, giving them a second chance and new purpose to serve a Veteran in need. Each pair who graduates from our program represents two lives saved – the Service Dog and the Warrior".

• "Hope on 5th promotes community services and provides shelter to central Illinois veterans, homeless and those at risk of homelessness through offering services and housing on an emergency, temporary, transitional, and permanent basis".
