

We encourage you to use this guide daily, working through each of the sections for each week.

CHILDREN





- Become an encouragement to the new pastor and his family because of what God has done in our lives as we prepare for his arrival.


As in water a face reflects the face, so the heart of a person reflects the person.

EMBRACING OUR STORY

WEEK THREE

What's your story? What "God story" is being written in your life? In the narrative of Scripture, we see story after story of how God individual people to bring about His Master plan. Most often, these folks did not realize how God was orchestrating the events of their lives to accomplish His greater purpose of salvation and redemption.

Think about:

- Joseph. What awful injustices he endured! But God was raising up a "savior" for his family.
- **Ruth.** A Moabite married an unfaithful Jew who died young, leaving her childless and destitute, but God had a plan to make her part of the bloodline of King David, and ultimately of Messiah.
- Moses. The youngest child of a Jewish slave couple in Egypt survived the slaughter of babies by the Pharoah and ended up in the palace as the adopted child of the princess, a time which helped prepare him to lead the children of Israel out of Egypt.

Do you know that God is working out His plan in your life in much the same way? What if you choose this year to look for God's story in your life, identify it, embrace that story, rehearse it, and reflect on it? You will realize that God doesn't waste anything in our lives. He is at work, even when we don't see it.

This week in your prayer time:

- **Pray for yourself.** Pray for God to open your eyes to discover His story in your life. Ask Him to help you see beyond your own trials and struggles so that you can rest in the fact that He is accomplishing a greater purpose beyond your human understanding.
- Pray for our church to see beyond the circumstances of our current situation and realize that God's purpose is for reconciliation, redemption, and ultimately His glory. He knows how He will orchestrate events to bring salvation to individuals, healing to families, growth of the church, blessing in the community, and expansion of His Kingdom through Temple Church.

MISSIONS/EVANGELISM





PERSEVERANCE IN PRAYER

WEEK FOUR

What about prayer? Has God taught you some things about prayer, fasting, worship, supplication, and praise in 2023? God works on us as we pray. He works through us when we pray. God accomplishes His purposes while we pray. In the Bible, we read the accounts of God carrying out His plan AS people prayed.

- Hannah prayed for God to give her a child. God answered her prayer, but gave her so much more, sending Samuel as the first judge of God's people. Even though she sacrificed greatly, painfully, in giving Samuel over to God, leaving her sweet little boy at the Temple with the old priest, God filled her life abundantly with five more children to ease the pain and bless her for her sacrifice.
- Anna was a faithful servant of the Lord, but her husband died when she was very young leaving her alone. She remained faithful. In fact, she gave her life to God's service, never leaving the Temple, serving day and night with fastings and prayers. (Luke 1:37). She didn't know that at the age of 84, Messiah would come.

Joseph and Mary would bring the baby Jesus, at that very moment she came up and began giving thanks to God, and continued to speak of Him to all those who were looking for the redemption of Israel. (1:38) Anna would be a witness to Messiah!

- In Acts 10 we find **Cornelius**, a devout Gentile in one town, praying to God continually, and Peter in a different town, praying to God on a rooftop, as was his practice. God stepped in unexpectedly in both of their lives, bringing them together and opening the way for the gospel to be given to the Gentiles.
- In Acts 13, the **Antioch church leaders** were ministering to the Lord and fasting. (vs 2). It was in the act of this spiritual practice that the Holy Spirit spoke to them, telling them to set aside Barnabus and Saul for the ministry of the Gospel to the Gentiles. (Note that these leaders were not praying specifically for missionaries to go to the Gentiles! It was AS they prayed that they received instruction from the Lord.)

Will you continue to grow in the practice of prayer in 2024? As you pray, God will be at work, above and beyond all that you can imagine!

Pray for the Pastor Search Team this month. Pray specifically for:

- **Discernment** as we work through the resumes that have been received and narrow the search to the ones who are best qualified based on the Pastor Profile.
- **Unity** as we develop the questionnaire to go out to qualified candidates.
- **Wisdom** as we narrow the search and begin to set up interviews for February.
- Reliance on the Holy Spirit throughout the process.

As you continue on into the year 2024, don't quit praying for Temple Church, just because God gives us a new pastor. Keep on praying for the pastor, his family, your family, our church, and our community. Your prayers matter to God. They are so precious that He keeps them forever before Him in heaven!

When He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each one holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. – Revelation 5:8 (NASB)

Another angel came and stood at the altar, holding a golden censer; and much incense was given to him so that he might add it to the prayers of all the saints on the golden altar which was before the throne.
