

Preamble

A bylaw is a legal statement related to the Local Church Constitution and clarifies the constitution as applied to the local situation. Matters related to the implementation of the constitution and bylaws are dealt with by way of policies and procedures, which must not be in conflict with the constitution or its bylaws.

Note: "Article No." refers to the number of the article in the Constitution.

Article I – Name

This church shall bear the corporate name of The Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada or the St. Albert Alliance Church of the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada.

Article VII – Government

1. The annual meeting of this church shall be convened during the first quarter of each year.
2. Notice in writing and public announcement shall be given at the worship services on two successive weekends prior to any business meeting of the membership.
3. A quorum for any business meeting of the membership shall consist of those members present at a duly called meeting.
4. In case of all boards and committees a majority of its members shall constitute a quorum.
5. Congregational approval shall be given by a majority of the members present at a duly called congregational meeting for the coming years-proposed budget. All capital expenditures not included in the budget involving an amount in excess of ten percent of the total approved budget must have congregational approval.

Article VIII – Elders Board

1. The Elders Board shall have a maximum of eleven (11) members including the Lead Pastor.
2. That each Elder is elected for a two-year term.
3. An elder may not be a member of the Elders Board for more than two (2) consecutive terms (four years) and may be eligible for re-election after a one-year absence.

Article XIV – Nominating Committee

1. The nominating committee shall consist of three (3) members from the Elders Board and three (3) from the membership in addition to the Lead Pastor.
