THE KALAM COSMOLOGICAL ARGUMENT

- 1. Whatever begins to exist has a cause
- 2. The universe began to exist
- 3. Therefore, the universe has a cause

2. THE UNIVERSE BEGAN TO EXIST

The world's largest library, the Library of Congress, has 36 million books. But imagine it contains an infinite number of books and there are an infinite number of red books and an infinite number of black books. For every red book, there is a black book and vice versa. If you asked the librarian how many red books they have? They'll respond an infinite amount. If you asked them how many total books they have (red and black) they'll say an infinite amount. Shouldn't the red books be a smaller number compared to the red and black books? Yes, but with an actual infinite you have as many red books as there are red and black books.



2. THE UNIVERSE BEGAN TO EXIST

In 1929 Edwin Hubble discovered evidence that galaxies are moving away from us based from the fact they emitted a redlight signature.

Stars and galaxies closer to us emit a cooler light signature but those farther away emit a redder signature.















WHEN SPACE EXPANDS, LIGHT STRETCHES

Since the big bang, the physical space of the universe has been expanding. Stars and galaxies maintain their size, but the space **between** them grows.

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THE TELEOLOGICAL ARGUMENT

- 2. The fine-tuning is not due to physical necessity or chance
- 3. Therefore, it is due to design

PHYSICAL CONSTANTS

Cosmological constant: the force that acts against gravity to cause the universe to expand

Approximate value: Λ≈1.1×10-52m-2 Probability: 10¹²⁰
