Saving Faith

The D-Cycle is a curriculum containing content designed to establish the scriptural foundations of the faith in the life of a believer.

VISION FOR SAVING FAITH

Saving Faith is the second point in the Decided portion of the D-Cycle. Saving Faith partnered with repentance brings us into right relationship with God. Saving Faith is trusting that Jesus Christ died for our sins on the cross, was buried in a tomb, and was resurrected from the dead by God. Without saving faith, we are unable to access the life, joy, and peace of Jesus.

Key Definitions

- Saving Faith: actively resting in the reality that Jesus died for our sin and God raised Him from the dead for us to be in right relationship with Him

Summary of Points

- 1. Faith is trusting that Jesus is the special Lamb of God sent to take away all sins of humanity. Because of His life, death, and resurrection, we can be forgiven and have a fresh start in life.
 - Jesus is the final sacrifice for the sins of humanity. His death in our place, and resurrection from the dead gives us access to new life where we are forgiven and set free.
- 2. Faith requires our verbal confession that 'Jesus is Lord'
 - Faith is not just internal. What we believe in our heart's overflows out of your mouths in declaring that Jesus is your Lord and the one in charge of our lives. This confession shows we really trust Him.
- 3. Faith is not a one-time event, but a continual trust in Jesus's resurrected life. Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father, his words are true, and we follow Jesus by obeying his commands.
 - Faith doesn't end after one moment or prayer. It's a continual confidence to keep trusting that Jesus is alive and working in our lives right now.
 - a. Jesus isn't just a figure from the past; He's alive and seated in heaven, demonstrating his authority and power over every being seen or unseen.
 - b. Everything Jesus says is true and real. Because He is the creator, we can trust His teachings to align with the world we live in.

- c. Being a follower of Jesus means living out what He teaches even when we may disagree.
- 4. Because of Jesus, we can experience life to the full—one of deep joy, peace, and hope, even when things are hard.
