Water Baptism

The D-Cycle is a curriculum containing content designed to establish the scriptural foundations of the faith in the life of a believer.

VISION FOR WATER BAPTISM

Water Baptism is the third point in the Decided portion of the D-Cycle. Water Baptism is a physical action in obedience to Jesus following repentance and faith in Him. Water Baptism is not merely an outward sign, but an external manifestation of a spiritual reality at work in the life of a believer.

Key Definitions

- Water Baptism: the immersion of the believer in water in the name of the Father, his Son Jesus, and Holy Spirit

Summary of Points

Baptism is a command by Jesus for all who follow Him to be immersed in water in the name of the Father,
 Son, and Holy Spirit

Baptism is part of the process of obeying God. Jesus, even though he was perfect, got baptized declaring that it was to "fulfill all righteousness" or to live in right relationship with God.

2. Baptism occurs in the context of community

Baptism isn't a private event, it typically happens in the context of others who can celebrate our decision to follow Jesus and support us moving forward.

3. Baptism requires repentance and faith in the saving work of Jesus on the cross

Before baptism, we must choose to change our mind and ways about the way the world works and follow in Jesus' ways.

- 4. In being immersed in water, we are being buried with Christ in His death.
- 5. In the same way Jesus was raised from the dead by the Father, we are raised into newness of life when we come out of the water.
- 6. Baptism is a physical event that affects our whole being body, soul, spirit.
