Around the Word Devotions + the week of May 18-24, 2025

THEME OF THE WEEK: **He is Risen to Proclaim the Truth**

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! The joy and light of the Lord's resurrection continues to enlighten our hearts and minds this week. The Scripture passages selected this week put before us the tremendous gifts of God for us. God gives us His Spirit, His righteousness, His deliverance, His freedom, His forgiveness, and His enduring promise of everlasting life with Him. God be praised!

SUN

SCRIPTURE: **John 16:5-15 "The Advantage of Jesus Departure"**

The night before the crucifixion Jesus tells His disciples, "It is to your advantage that I go away." How could that possibly be the case? What could be better than having Jesus there with them? "If I depart, I will send Him to you." Who? The Holy Spirit, here called the Parakletos in Greek, the Comforter, the Helper, or (best) the Advocate who will bring about faith in your heart and peace in your conscience. He will convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment, and He will guide the church into all truth. This is the advantage, and we have it. We are born of water and the Spirit, and Jesus has sent the gift of the Holy Spirit to all who are baptized. *O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful people. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 82 "Gods Among Mere Mortals...Or Not"**

The Lord establishes earthly authorities. The purpose is the preservation of this world by means of the Law—just judgments, protection from wickedness, and upholding what is good. But civil righteousness and human authority will never save this world. Only the Gospel does that. God, pictured in this Psalm as sitting in the midst of a council of kings whom He addresses as "gods," gives a vivid reminder: even the kings die like any other mortal man. Let us never put our faith in this world's authorities, even as we honor them. *Lord, save Your people and bless those You have placed over us. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: **James 1:16-21 "The Implanted Word"**

We are sure that we can save our souls, or that our good works or good nature can save our souls, but this is a lie. We are, at our best, vanity, and at our worst the enemies of God and everything holy. No, we cannot save ourselves, but Jesus can save us. That is His vocation: Savior. He speaks His Word for this very reason: to save and rescue us from our sin, from death, and from the power of the devil. So James warns us to put aside wickedness and anger, and to humbly receive this Word "which is able to save your souls." That word is implanted in our hearts in our baptism, in our hearing the Word and promises. *O Lord, thank You for putting Your Word of life into my dying heart. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: **Isaiah 12:1-6 "God Is Not Angry?"**

If the righteousness of our anger must be questioned, the Lord's must not. It is no surprise to learn that He is justly wrathful at our sins; it is a great surprise to discover that He is gracious to us in Jesus Christ, turning from His anger, and instead comforting us by being our salvation instead of our doom. This is the new song of the Church, which had already begun in the voice of the prophets. The Lord has entered our midst not in wrath but in peace, working salvation for those who have not deserved it. His grace is the cause of our great joy. *Lord, You are my salvation. I will trust and will not be afraid. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: **John 8:21-36 "The Necessity for Jesus to Die"**

Jesus, in our text, reveals the necessity of His death. He tells the Jews arguing with Him that they will know the truth of what Jesus says when He is lifted up. We know that He was lifted up by the cross. At the cross and the empty tomb we see the truth of all Jesus said. From the events of His crucifixion with the darkness and the earthquake to His physical resurrection, it all becomes clear Jesus truly is God and has been sent by His Father. It was necessary for Jesus to die so that we might see His truth and glory, which shines even into our day and into eternity. *O Lord, I praise You for Your dying for me and rising again. Through Your blood, I am healed and forgiven. Grant that I may see Your glory all my days. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: **2 Corinthians 5:14-21 "One Died For All"**

What a great exchange! The sinless One bears our sins so that we might have the righteousness of God. The One Who is Life tastes our death so that we could have life eternal. The One Who is strong to save is made weak so that we would stand forever. Christ is forsaken by God so that we would never be abandoned or forgotten. By His stripes we are healed. God be praised! Our trespasses are imputed to Him, not to us! His holiness and perfection are given to us as a gift. He is the First-fruits, and we are part of His New Creation and eternal kingdom. *O Lord we thank You for bearing our sin, and granting us Your righteousness. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 126 "Out With Tears, In With Joy"**

The Lord turns things around, and this Psalm praises Him for it. Sowing with tears; reaping with joy. Going forth with weeping; returning rejoicing. He brings us out of captivity. He delivers from bondage. He transfers us from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of the light of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Egypt is behind us. Babylon is long ago. The grave is broken; its power spoiled. Jesus' death and resurrection are our deliverance, and it fills our mouths with laughter and sets our tongue to song. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!
