Around the Word Devotions + the week of November 2-8, 2025

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Blessedness of the Saints of God

This week of All Saints' reminds us of three biblical truths. First, that God desires all men to be saved and invites us to communion with Him through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ. Secondly, that in this world of sin and unbelief, the Christian saint will have no lack of trouble. And thirdly, God will at last take His saints to Himself in heaven, where together with all who trust in His promises they will receive the fullness of the comfort and joy promised to them on earth. Lord Jesus, preserve us in these precious truths of Your Word until we see You face to face! Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 5:1-12 "The Blessedness of the Christian Life"

Today, the Lord reminds us through His Word what true blessedness is. The world, and even our own tainted hearts locate blessedness in the things of this world – money, health, pleasure, a healthy family, friends, and the like. Jesus upends our expectations by locating blessedness for us in Himself alone. Those who are blessed will surely experience persecution and hardship for His sake, for the joy of the saint is not found in this world, which is ever at odds with the preaching of the Word, but in the only true God and His kingdom of grace. Lord Jesus, we are blessed in Your forgiveness alone. Keep us steadfast in Your Word and truth. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 125 "The Lord Surrounds His Saints"

"The scepter of wickedness shall not rest on the land allotted to the righteous..." The reason for this reminder is that sometimes the rule of evil does indeed come upon God's people as they are put under foot, maligned, and persecuted for confessing Jesus. This psalm is a psalm of perseverance. Though the wicked rule often in unrighteousness, the Lord surrounds His saints like the mountains of Jerusalem. He stands guard over them. Jesus has already defeated evil
at the cross and the battle is already won. The end is certain. Zion, that is, the
Holy Church cannot be moved, and in His time, the Lord will bring her home at
last. Lord Jesus, come quickly! Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Revelation 7:2-17 "The Vision of Heaven"

Who we are in life will not be destroyed, but perfected. The Lord grants John a vision of what is going on in Heaven and oh, what a sight it is! John sees all the different peoples and languages and tribes and nations all confessing the Christ, waving palms of victory. Heaven therefore is not some egalitarian kingdom of sameness, where every saint looks, speaks, and acts just the same. That is boring. Instead God perfects our natures in Christ. John clearly recognizes distinct peoples and attributes. So it is that those attributes which so delight you in your Christian friends and family in this life, God will perfect in the resurrection and life everlasting. That is who they really are! God grant us by faith to be in that blessed number. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 51:9-16 "Faith in the Midst of Fear"

When God speaks His Word to us, they have the force of an oath (V. Herberger). When God says to us "You are my people" (vs 16) He means it. We are His dear treasure. But how often our flesh forgets. We fear all manner of things. We fear men and what they can do to us (vs. 12). We forget that it is the Lord Who has redeemed us with His precious blood and will lead us to the Zion of our eternal home with singing, where sorrowing and sighing shall flee away (vs. 11). So the Lord reminds us. He speaks His Word to us "And I have put my words in your mouth" (vs. 15). His preached word comforts us in the midst of our trials

that we would fear no evil. Lord keep us attentive to Your promises to us, that we would not despair. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 9:18-26 "Funeral Crasher"

A dirge plays in the background while mourners mourn in the foreground. That is a funeral in a nutshell, and tell me, what else is to be done at death? We sit and we weep and sing a song of lament for the dead. But then Jesus comes sweeping onto the scene and speaks of death as only "sleep." To us this is laughable, but to Him death is no more than an afternoon nap from which He wakes up His precious little children. It is quite the dichotomy, for Jesus weeps at death too. But He weeps as one Who still has the victory, Who hates this enemy that brings pain and sorrow, even though He has all authority over it. Perhaps that is how we should weep as well: not as ones who have no hope, but as ones who know that the victory is ours because the victory is His. Yes, death still stings, but the sting lasts but for a moment. Jesus, take us by the hand and

raise us from the dead. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Colossians 1:9-14 "Spiritual Understanding"

Paul prayed for the Colossian saints that they "might be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding." May God grant it to us. Spiritual wisdom knows what earthly wisdom cannot know: first. that we are sinners deserving the wrath of God. Second, that the Son of God has suffered in our place to win eternal righteousness. Third, that God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our heart, praying and helping us along in this troubled life. Fourth, that the best is yet to come. We will inherit the light of the glory of God, the peace of heaven which will give way to the joy of the resurrection and

the new heaven and earth. O Lord, give us Your Spirit and a spiritual understanding of all things. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 18:1-19 "The Lord is My Stay"

The Psalms remind us that we are surrounded by enemies and encircled with trouble. "In this world you will have tribulation." The world, our own sinful flesh, the devil with all the demons all attack, swiping away at our faith and our life. But the LORD has not left us alone. The LORD is on our side. He is our rock, our fortress, our deliverer, our strength, our trust, our shield, our helmet of salvation, our high tower, our help, our stay. His strength is our confidence. His goodness is our hope. I will love You, O LORD my strength. Amen.
