

5-Day Devotional: Walking in Spiritual Riches

Day 1: The Eyes of Your Heart

****Reading:**** Ephesians 1:15-18

****Devotional:****

Paul's prayer reveals a profound truth: we can possess everything in Christ yet live spiritually blind to our inheritance. The "eyes of your heart" represent your spiritual perception—the ability to see beyond circumstances into eternal realities. Many believers struggle not because God is withholding grace, but because their spiritual vision has grown dim. Today, pause before every decision and pray, "Lord, enlighten the eyes of my heart." Ask God to flood your inner being with light so you can truly see what you already possess in Jesus. This isn't about gaining more from God, but perceiving what He's already given. When your heart-eyes open, everything changes—your confidence grows, your anxiety diminishes, and your worship deepens.

Day 2: The Hope of His Calling

****Reading:**** Romans 8:28-30; 1 Peter 1:3-5

****Devotional:****

Biblical hope is not wishful thinking—it's confident expectation rooted in God's character and promises. The Greek word **elpis** describes an anchor-deep assurance that God will complete what He started. When God calls, His intended result happens. He called light from darkness, Lazarus from the tomb, and you from death to life. Your future isn't fragile or uncertain; it's secured by divine calling. Whatever chapter you're currently living isn't the final one—God has already written your victorious ending. In a world saturated with anxiety, this hope gives you a different posture: steady, grounded confidence. Your circumstances don't write your story; God's calling does. Today, replace "I hope God can" with "I know God will."

Day 3: God's Glorious Inheritance

****Reading:**** Ephesians 1:18-19; Colossians 1:27

****Devotional:****

Here's a stunning reversal: God doesn't just give you an inheritance—you ARE His inheritance. The church is God's treasured possession, His **klēronomia**, displaying the riches of His glory. When God looks at you, He sees overflowing wealth, not spare change. You carry within you the weighty beauty (**doxa**) of God's character. This means you're never ordinary. When people seem drawn to you, they're attracted to the Spirit

living in you. Your local church isn't just a gathering of like-minded people; it's the main stage where King Jesus displays His life, love, and authority. You exhibit "main character energy" in God's eternal story. Today, recognize your worth in God's eyes and let His glory radiate through your words and actions.

Day 4: Resurrection Power at Work

****Reading:**** Ephesians 1:19-23; Philippians 3:10-11

****Devotional:****

The same power that raised Jesus from death and enthroned Him above every authority is actively directed toward you. Paul stacks power words—**dynamis** (ability), **energeia** (energy in motion), **kratos** (ruling strength), **ischys** (sheer capacity)—to describe the immeasurable force available to believers. The Christian life isn't meant to run on spiritual fumes and human effort; it runs on resurrection power. This isn't distant cosmic energy—it's personal, present, and aimed at you. Every dimension of God's strength works on your behalf. Stop living from exhaustion and start living from resurrection power. Today, identify one area where you've been relying on your own strength. Invite God's **dynamis** to work through your weakness, transforming impossibility into testimony.

Day 5: Christ Over All, Head of the Church

****Reading:**** Ephesians 1:20-23; Colossians 1:15-20

****Devotional:****

Jesus sits enthroned "far above" every spiritual force, political structure, cultural movement, and named power. His authority isn't theoretical—it's absolute and active. But here's the breathtaking truth: He who rules over everything serves as Head of the church, His body. You're organically connected to the risen, reigning King. The church is "the fullness of Him who fills all in all"—the place where Christ's presence and rule become visible and tangible. This means there's nothing ordinary about your local fellowship. It's where resurrection life goes on display. When you gather, God's glory radiates. When you serve, Christ's authority manifests. You're not just attending religious events; you're participating in the cosmic unveiling of King Jesus. Today, engage with your church family knowing you're part of something immeasurably significant.

As you complete this devotional journey, continue praying Paul's prayer daily: "Father of glory, give me a spirit of wisdom and revelation in knowing You. Keep the eyes of my heart enlightened to see the hope of Your calling, the riches of Your inheritance, and the immeasurable greatness of Your power toward me as a believer."
