Seven Spirits of Revelation: The Spirit of Knowledge Small Group Guide

Opening Prayer:

Begin your session with a prayer, asking God to open your hearts and minds to His Spirit of Knowledge.

Key Takeaways:

- 1. The Spirit of Knowledge is about intimate, relational knowing of God, not just facts about Him.
- 2. There's a difference between knowing God's deeds and knowing His ways.
- 3. True spiritual knowledge leads to joy and a deeper relationship with God.
- 4. The Spirit of Knowledge helps us see things as God sees them, not as they appear to the world.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. The pastor mentions Psalm 103:6-8 as life verses. What stood out to you about these verses, and do you have any life verses that keep you grounded in your faith?
- 2. How would you describe the difference between knowing facts about someone and truly knowing them intimately? How does this apply to our relationship with God?
- 3. The sermon distinguishes between knowledge (da'at), understanding (binah), and wisdom (chokmah). How do you see these three working together in your spiritual life?

- 4. Reflect on this quote from Charles Spurgeon: "A little knowledge OF God is worth more than a great deal of knowledge ABOUT Him." What does this mean to you practically?
 5. The pastor asks, "Do you truly know God, or do you just know about Him?" How would you honestly answer this question for yourself?
- 6. How can we move from simply having information about God to experiencing true intimacy with Him?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Daily Prayer Challenge: Each morning this week, pray: "Holy Spirit, teach me to know You—deeply, relationally, truthfully."
- 2. Scripture Meditation: Spend time meditating on Philippians 3:10 "That I may know Him, and the power of His resurrection." Journal your thoughts and insights.
- 3. Relationship Audit: Make a list of ways you currently pursue knowledge of God. Then, brainstorm new ways to deepen your relational knowledge of Him.
- 4. Acts of Obedience: Identify one area where you can apply the knowledge God has given you. Share with the group and commit to acting on it this week.
- 5. Testimony Time: At your next meeting, come prepared to share a moment where you felt you truly experienced knowing God, not just knowing about Him.

Closing Prayer:

Close your session by praying together, asking the Holy Spirit to increase your knowledge of God in a deep, transformative way.
