## **Seven Spirits Of Revelation Week Two Devotional**

Day 1: Seeking Divine Wisdom

Reading: Proverbs 2:1-11

Devotional: In a world full of confusion and uncertainty, we often find ourselves yearning for clear direction. Today's reading reminds us that true wisdom comes from God. Just as the sermon highlighted the "Spirit of Wisdom," we see here that wisdom is a treasure to be sought after diligently. As you read, reflect on areas in your life where you need God's wisdom. How can you actively seek His guidance? Remember, wisdom isn't just knowledge, but the ability to apply God's truth to your life. Today, commit to pursuing God's wisdom through prayer, study of His Word, and listening to the Holy Spirit's guidance.

Day 2: Reviving a Dormant Faith

Reading: Revelation 3:1-6

Devotional: The church in Sardis had a reputation for being alive, but was spiritually dormant. This mirrors our own lives at times - we may appear active in our faith externally, but inside we're running on empty. Today's passage calls us to "wake up" and strengthen what remains. Reflect on the areas of your spiritual life that may have become routine or lifeless. How can you rekindle your passion for Christ? Remember, Jesus holds the "seven spirits of God" - the fullness of the Holy Spirit. Invite His reviving presence into your life today, asking Him to breathe new life into your faith.

Day 3: Empowered by the Spirit

Reading: Zechariah 4:1-14

Devotional: "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit," says the Lord. These words, spoken to Zerubbabel, remind us that our strength comes not from our own efforts, but from God's Spirit. In the face of seemingly insurmountable obstacles, it's tempting to rely on our own resources or give up entirely. Yet God calls us to depend on His Spirit. Think about the challenges you're facing right now. How might your perspective change if you truly believed that God's Spirit is working through you? Today, consciously surrender your striving to God and ask for His Spirit to empower you in every task.

Day 4: Enlightened Hearts

Reading: Ephesians 1:15-23

Devotional: Paul's prayer for the Ephesians is a powerful reminder of what God desires for us - hearts and minds enlightened to the hope we have in Christ. This "Spirit of wisdom and revelation" isn't just about making good decisions; it's about truly knowing God. As you read this passage, pause to pray these words over yourself and your loved ones. Ask God to open the eyes of your heart to see the hope of His calling, the riches of His inheritance, and the greatness of His power. How might your daily life change if you lived with a constant awareness of these truths?

Day 5: Joy in Uncertainty

Reading: James 1:2-8

Devotional: Our natural response to trials and uncertainty is often fear or frustration. Yet James tells us to consider it pure joy when we face trials of many kinds. This seems counterintuitive, but it's rooted in the understanding that God uses these challenges to refine and mature our faith. Reflect on a current difficulty you're facing. How might God be using this to develop perseverance and maturity in you? Remember, as we learned in the sermon, the Spirit of Wisdom can bring joy-filled peace even in unsettled times. Today, ask God for the wisdom to see your trials from His perspective and the strength to find joy in the midst of them.
