- All it takes is ONE generation for the Word and worship of God to be lost!




















#### **LAW**

- God's commands, threats, punishments...
  - —Commands for conquering Jericho
  - The destruction of the city and its inhabitants (and likewise the other Canaanites)
  - God allowed Israel's enemies to oppress them because of their idolatry


## Gospel

- God's mercy, forgiveness, goodness, and promises...
  - —God gave his people victory
  - —God kept his promise to give Israel the Promised Land
  - Rahab and her family became believers and were spared
  - —God had pity on Israel when they cried out to him and sent judges to save them
