- During a time of universal common language (Greek) and government (the Roman Empire).

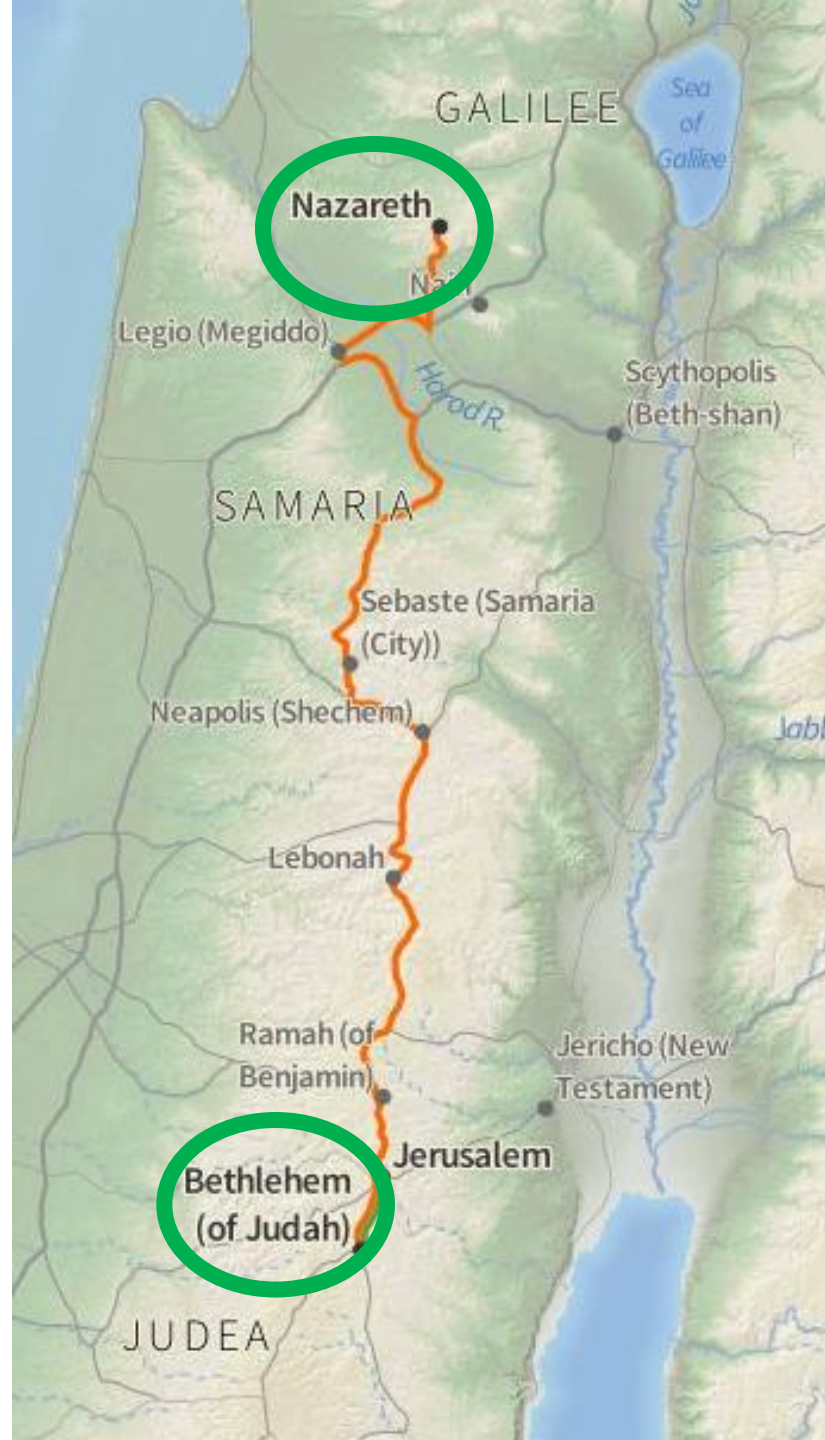

in 117 AD, at its greatest extent

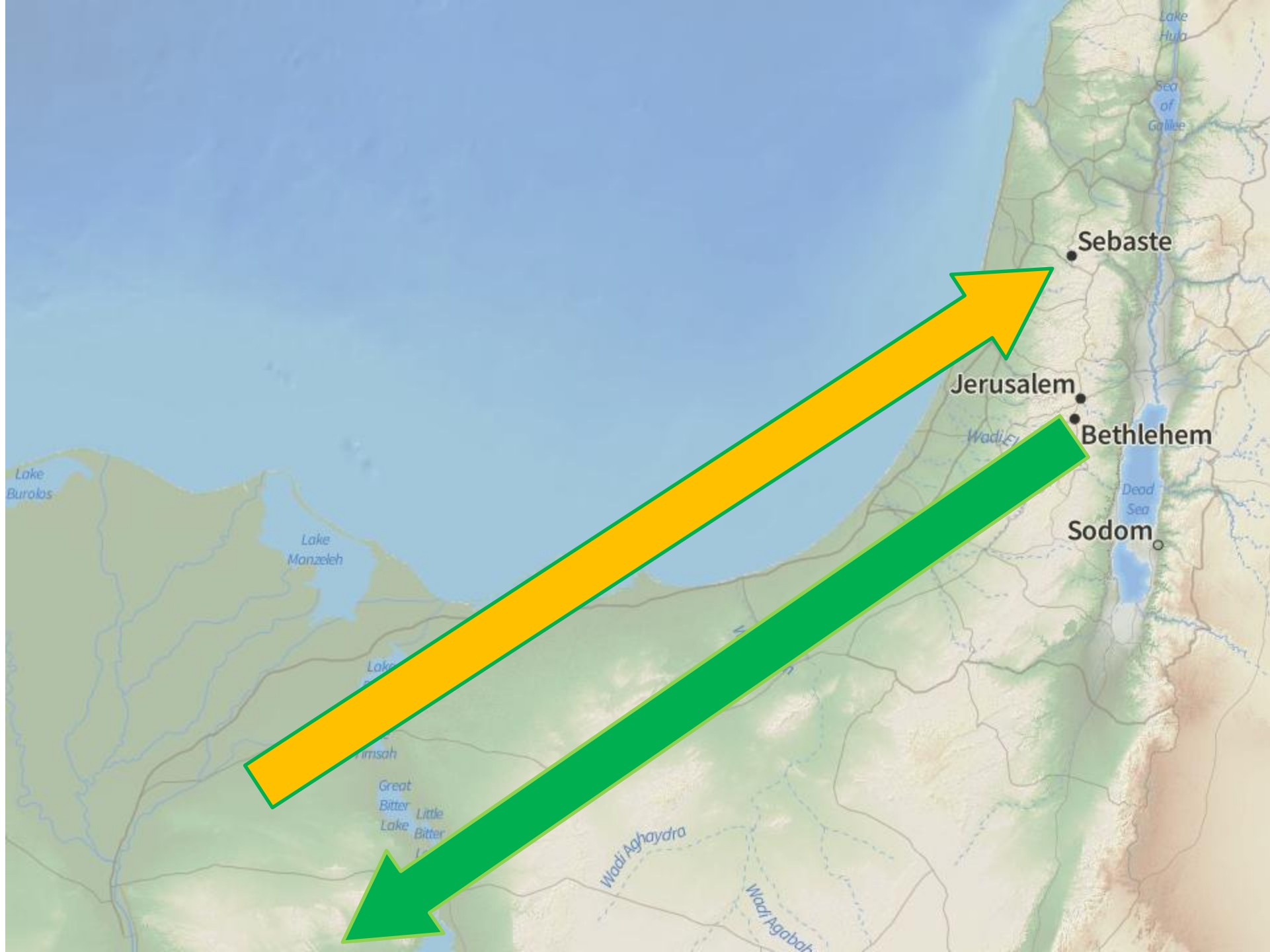




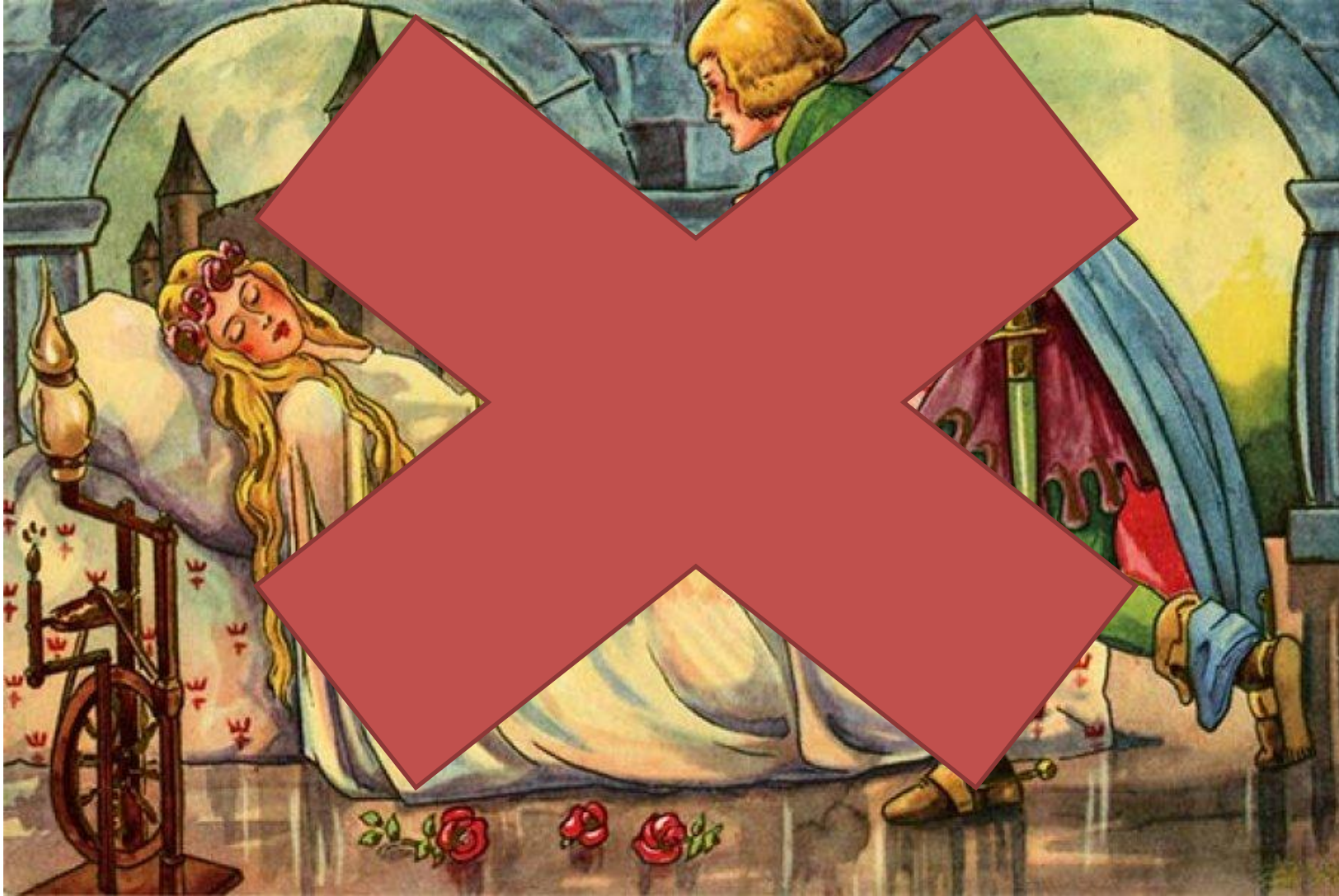

2.) Read 1:34-37. How would Mary, a virgin, become pregnant with Jesus Christ?

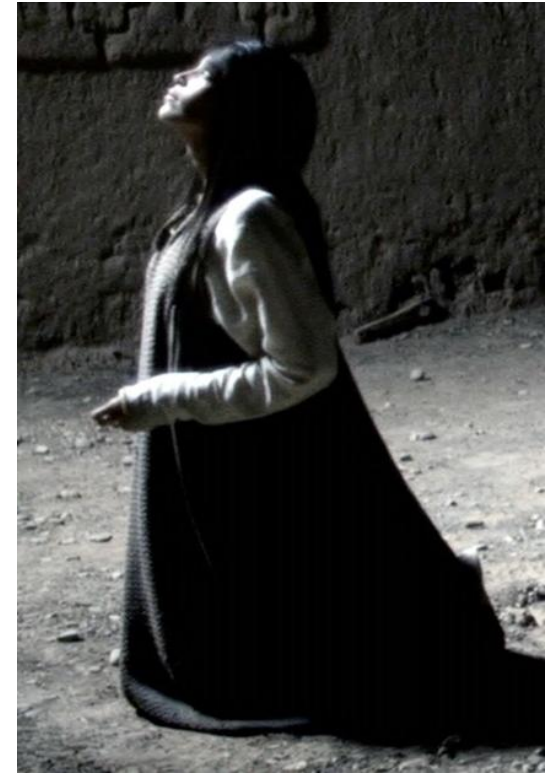
- The Holy Spirit would perform this miracle.

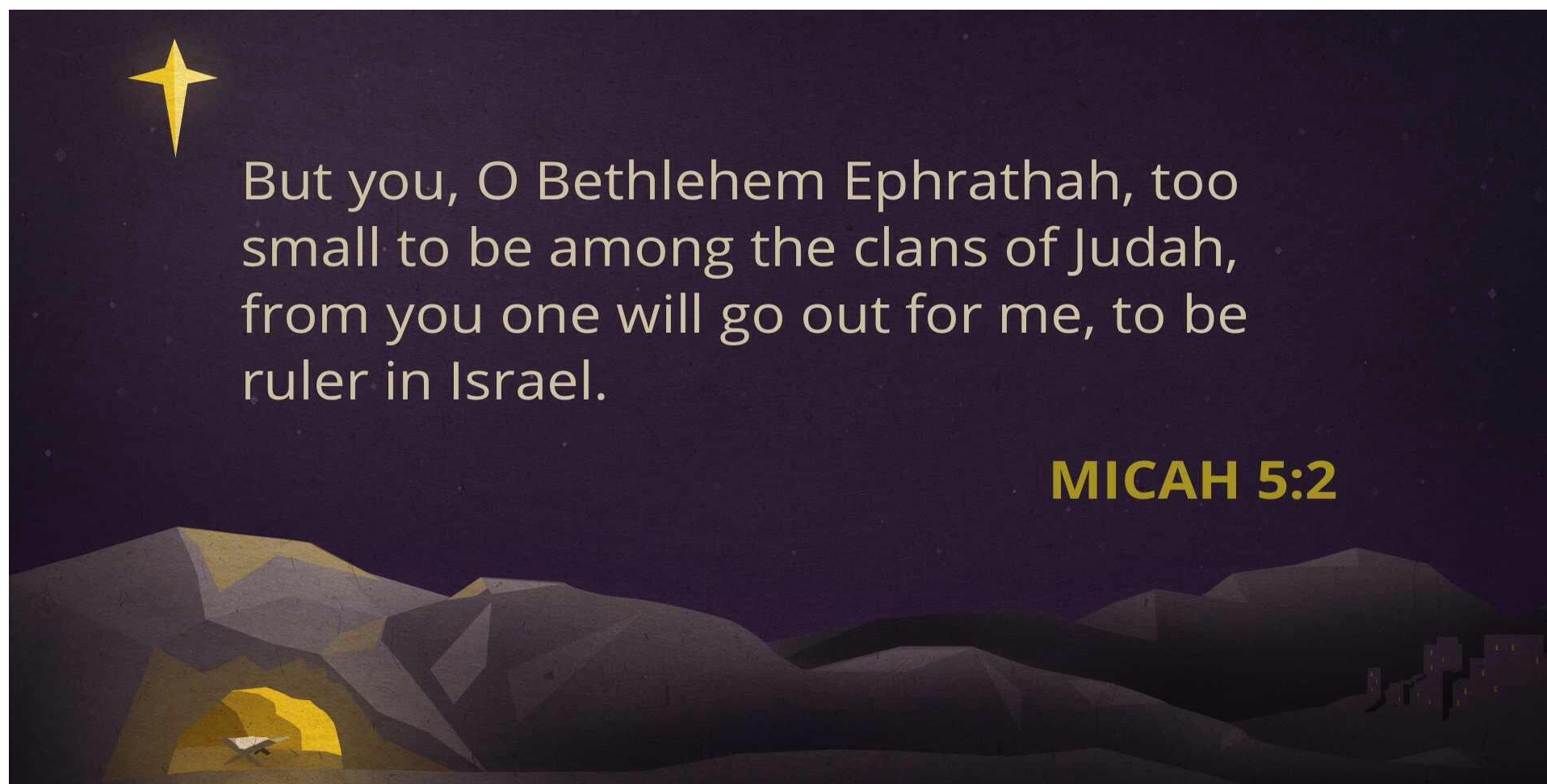

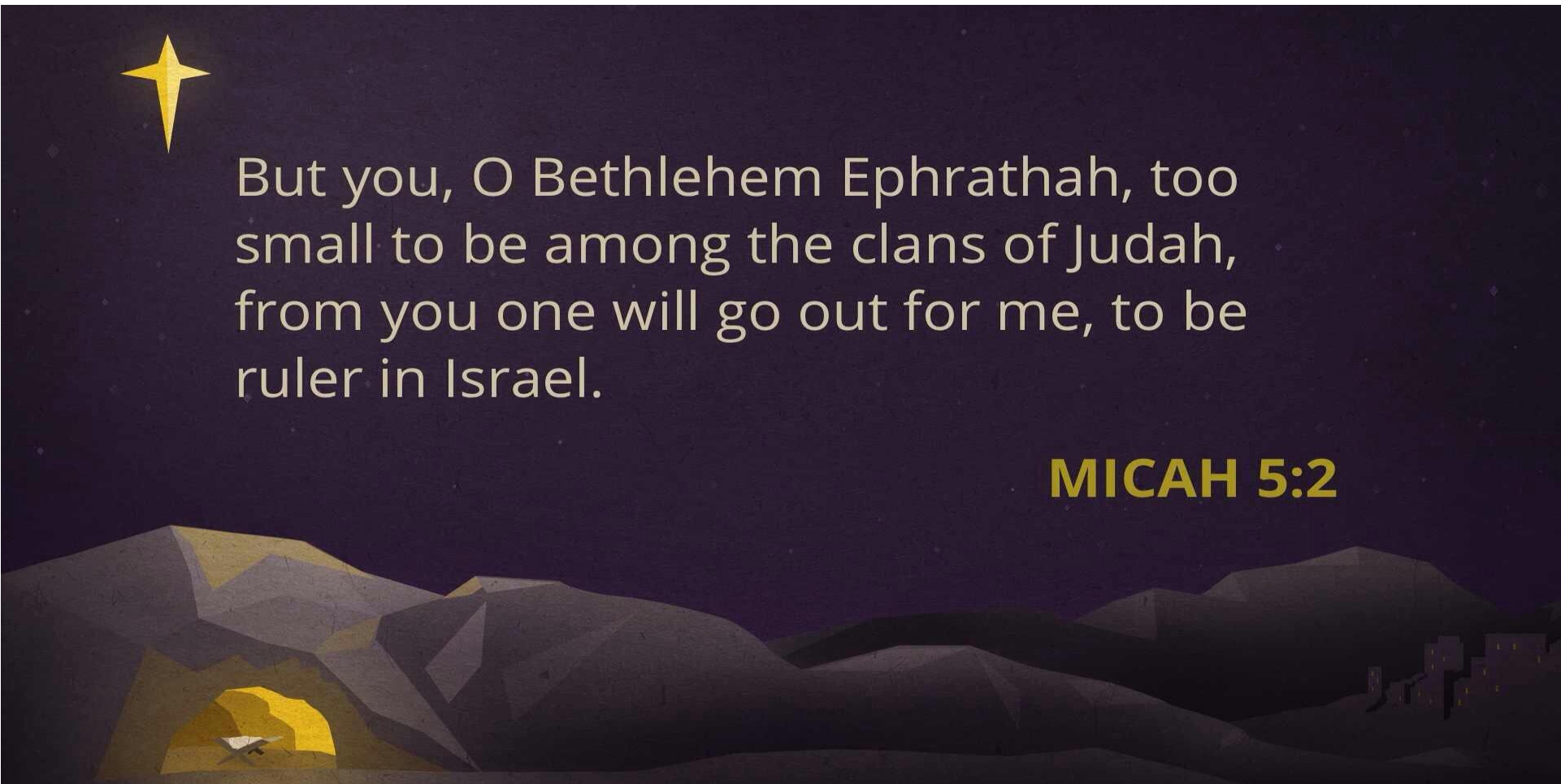
Read: Luke 2:1-7

Read: Luke 2:8-20

b.) The magi: wanted to worship Jesus, and brought him their best gifts.



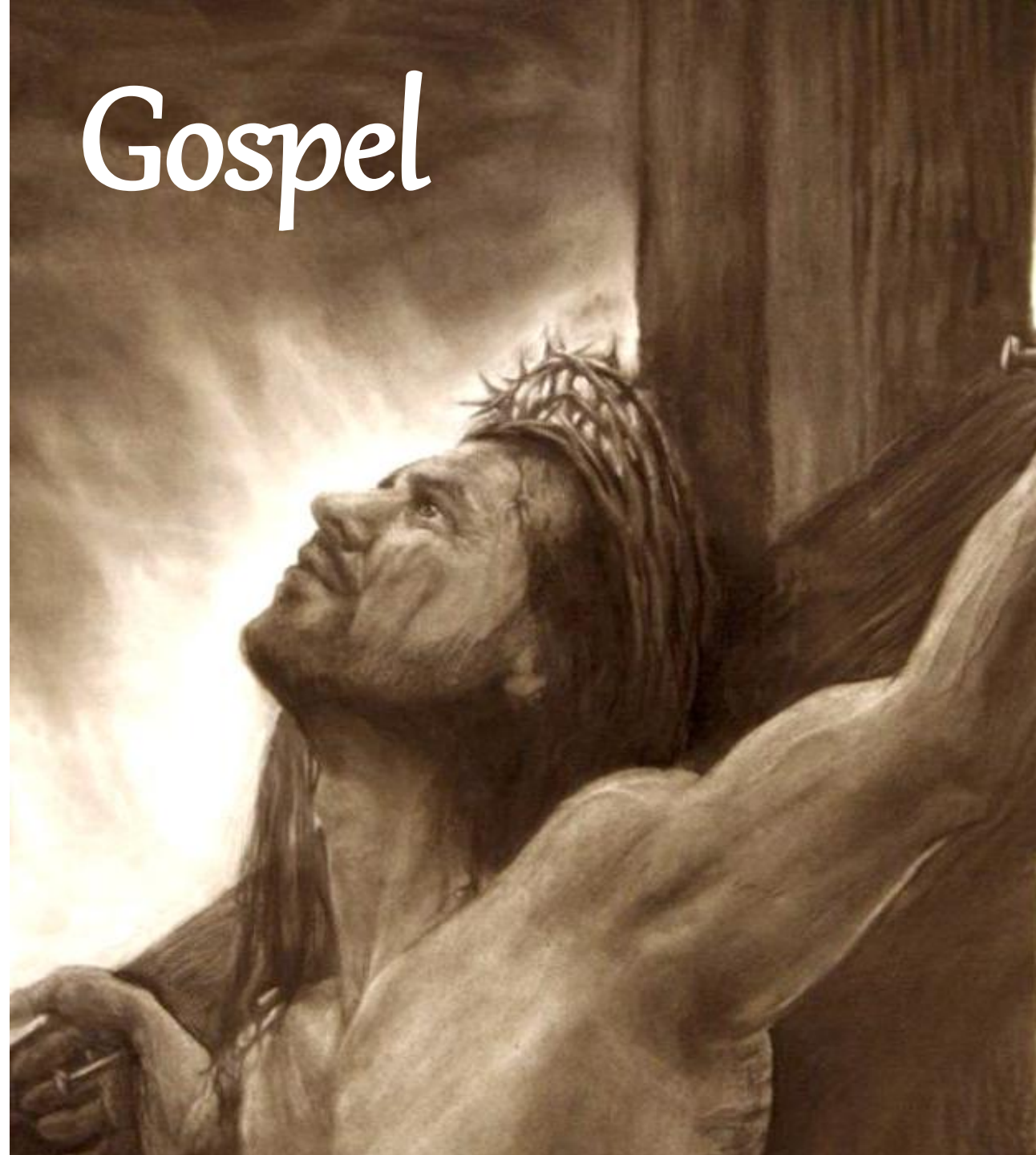

- God's commands, threats, punishments...
 - We needed a Savior from our sins
 - Fear of Mary and shepherds at the sight of holy angels
 - Through angels God gives commands to Mary, Joseph, wise men, etc.

Gospel

- God's mercy, forgiveness, goodness, and promises...
 - As long foretold God sent his only Son into the world on a mission to take away our sins
 - God's choosing Mary to be Christ's mother
 - God sent angels and a miraculous star to proclaim that Christ is born
 - God protected Jesus and family from danger

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?



John 1:1-3a, 14 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made... The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

John 1:1-3a, 14 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made... The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

- The Son of God, the eternal Word, became a human being.
- This is a mystery that cannot be understood with our mind but only believed by faith!



Psalm 145:13 The LORD is faithful to all his promises.

- God ALWAYS fulfills his promises.
- God kept the promise to send the Savior despite thousands of years of human unfaithfulness and sin!!



Galatians 4:4-5 When the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons.

- God guided all time and history so that the Savior would come at the right time and place.



John 3:16-17 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

- Jesus is the living proof of God's love
- God gave us the most precious thing he had!
- Jesus came for one reason—to take our sins away and give us peace with God!
