### CONTEXT...

#### WHO?

- Mary: a virgin from the family of King David
- Joseph: a carpenter from Nazareth from the family of King David
- Angel Gabriel and others
- Magi: astrologers/wise men from the east (exact location and number unknown)
- King Herod: Ruler of Judea, under Roman control, ruthless and power-hungry

} Engaged = legally married

#### WHEN?

- During the reign of Caesar Augustus and governorship of Quirinius
- Jesus was born sometime around 3-2 B.C., the magi arrived about 2 years later.
- During Jesus' life there was a common language (Greek) and government (the Roman Empire) throughout the Mediterranean world
