Overall Tone (0-2)
0 - The story was retold in a way that was disrespectful

Setting/Bible Reference (0 – 3)
0 - There was no setting or Bible reference given.
(example: "There was once a man named Noah")
1 - The Biblical setting was established, but no Bible reference given.
(example: "Some time after Adam and Eve sinned their children became more and more corrupt and fell into unbelief until there was only one believer left named, Noah")
2 - The Biblical setting was established, and the Bible reference (as a book) given.
(example: "In the book of Genesis it records how after Adam and Eve sinned their children became more and more corrupt and fell into unbelief")
3 - The Biblical setting was established, and the Bible reference (as a chapter and book) given.
(example: "In Genesis chapters 6-9 it records how after Adam and Eve sinned their children became more and more corrupt and fell into unbelief")
Orderliness (0-3)
0 - Retelling of events so mixed up as to make story unrecognizable or incoherent
1 - Events were retold, but in a mostly mixed up order
2 - Events were retold, with only a few details out of order
3 - Events were retold in a clear and orderly way, faithful to Biblical narrative
Detail (0-4)
