For Discussion:

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 6. What are your observations?
- 2. From reading 1 Corinthians 6, what do you think the cultural norms were in Corinth relating to civil lawsuits and sexual immorality? Are there any correlations to our culture today?
- 3. Why is it tempting for Christians to take civil matters to the court system?
- 4. Discuss the implications of the words "washed", "sanctified", and "justified" in verse 11.
- 5. Are there any civil disputes that you need help resolving?
- 6. "Everything is permissible for me" and "food is for the stomach and the stomach for food" were culturally accepted opinions in Corinth. What are some wrong culturally accepted beliefs in our day?
- 7. Why do you think sexual sin impacts us differently than other sins (verse 18b)?
- 8. Paul says that our body is the temple of the Holy Spirit (verse 19) and uses that as a reason to flee sexual sin. What are some other implications of this truth for our lives?

For Response and Application:

- 1. Is there any sexual sin that you need to confess and begin to flee?
- 2. Are there any action steps that the Holy Spirit is asking you to take as a result of this message?
- 3. Which part of this message did you find most helpful? Which part of this message did you find most challenging?
