Small Group Q&A - A Follower Of Jesus - Disciple

Text: Matthew 11:28-30, Luke 6:40, Matthew 28:19-20

Sermon Reflection

Pastor Ross reminded us that being a Christian means being a disciple—a learner of Jesus. Discipleship begins with belief but leads to transformation. When we "yoke up" with Jesus, we learn from Him, become like Him, and are sent out to help others do the same.

1. Come and Learn

Jesus invites the weary to come and learn from Him. What does it mean for you personally to "yoke up" with Jesus instead of trying to carry life's burdens alone? (How could learning from Jesus lighten your load this week?)

2. Commitment to Jesus

True discipleship requires full commitment—not one foot in and one foot out. In what ways might you be hesitating to go "all in" with Jesus?

(What would it look like to fully commit to learning from Him?)

3. Becoming Like Christ

Luke 6:40 says a student, when fully trained, becomes like the teacher. How are you seeing yourself becoming more like Christ through what you're learning? (What area of your life still needs His teaching most?)

4. Go and Teach

Discipleship doesn't end with learning; it leads to going. Who in your life could you begin sharing what Jesus has taught you?

(How might your obedience help someone else know Christ?)

5. Prayer & Community

Pray that your group would remain learners under Jesus—committed, teachable, and ready to go where He leads.

(Ask God to keep shaping you into His likeness so you can lead others into the same life-changing relationship.
