Special Services

St. James the Apostle

St. James the Apostle—often called James the Greater—was one of Jesus' closest disciples and a key figure in the New Testament. He was the son of Zebedee and the brother of John, both fishermen whom Jesus called early in His ministry. Together, James and John were nicknamed the "Sons of Thunder" (Mark 3:17), likely for their boldness and fiery zeal.

James was part of Jesus' inner circle, along with Peter and John. These three witnessed some of the most pivotal moments in Jesus' life, including the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor and the

Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. According to Acts 12:1–2, James was the first of the apostles to be martyred—executed by the sword under King Herod Agrippa around 44 AD.

In Anglican tradition, James is honored on July 25th, and his life is celebrated as a model of faithful discipleship. The Church of England's collect for his feast day prays that we, like James, may be ready to answer Christ's call without delay.

There's also a rich tradition that his remains rest in Santiago de Compostela in Spain, a major pilgrimage site for centuries. And while the Epistle of James in the New Testament is traditionally attributed to James the Just (a different James, the brother of Jesus), both figures are revered for their deep commitment to the early Church. - **Prayers for the Natural Order**: For rain, harvest, and conservation.
- Prayers for Family and Personal Life: For birthdays, guidance, protection, and those we love.
- Thanksgivings: For the Church, the nation, heroic service, the beauty of the earth, and personal blessings.
