Special Services

St. Philip & St. James, Apostles -

In the Anglican tradition, St. Philip and St. James are celebrated together on May 1st, a feast day that honors their roles as apostles and their contributions to the early Church. This observance has deep historical roots, with references to their feast appearing as early as the 4th century in lectionaries like that of St. Jerome.

Philip is remembered for his evangelistic zeal, as seen in the Gospel of John, where he invites Nathanael to meet Jesus, declaring, "We have found Him of whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote" (John 1:45). James, often identified as "James the Less," is celebrated for his humility and leadership in the Jerusalem Church, as well as his emphasis on living out faith through actions, as reflected in the Epistle of James.

The Anglican Church continues to honor these apostles as foundational figures of the faith emphasizing their example of discipleship and their role in spreading the Gospel. (StBenedictAnglican.com, LivingFaithAnglican.org, St. JudesRec.org)

Rogation Sunday -

Rogation Sunday, observed in the Anglican tradition, is celebrated on the Sixth Sunday of Easter (the fifth Sunday after Easter Sunday). It marks the beginning of the Rogation Days, which are the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday leading up to Ascension Day. The term "Rogation" comes from the Latin word *rogare*, meaning "to ask," reflecting the prayers offered during this time for God's blessings on agriculture, industry, and the environment.

Historically, Rogation Sunday and the subsequent Rogation Days have included practices such as processions, the recitation of the Great Litany, and blessings of the fields. These traditions emphasize human dependence on God's providence and the importance of stewardship of the earth. (AnglicanCompass.com)

Ascension Day -

Ascension Day, celebrated in the Anglican tradition, occurs 40 days after Easter and commemorates Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven. This feast day is a significant part of the liturgical calendar, marking the completion of Jesus' earthly ministry and His exaltation at the right hand of God.

The event is described in the Gospels and the Book of Acts, where Jesus ascends to heaven in the presence of His disciples after blessing them. It signifies both the conclusion of His earthly work and the beginning of the Church's mission, empowered by the Holy Spirit. Ascension Day is often observed with special services, hymns, and prayers that reflect on its theological importance. (AnglicanCompass.com, Anglicanway.org)

Morning Prayer

Anglican Morning Prayer is a structured form of worship that begins the day with praise, confession, Scripture reading, and prayer. It is part of the Daily Office, which includes Morning Prayer, Midday Prayer, Evening Prayer, and Compline. Morning Prayer typically consists of three main parts:

- 1. **Preparation**: This includes a confession of sins and responses to prepare the heart for worship.
- 2. **Proclamation**: Features readings from Psalms, Scripture, and Canticles (songs based on Scripture).
- 3. **Prayers**: Includes the Lord's Prayer, written prayers from church history, and personal prayers.

Morning Prayer can be said individually or in a group, and it is often led by an officiant. It is a way to dedicate the day to God and seek His guidance and blessings. (AnglicanCompass.com)
