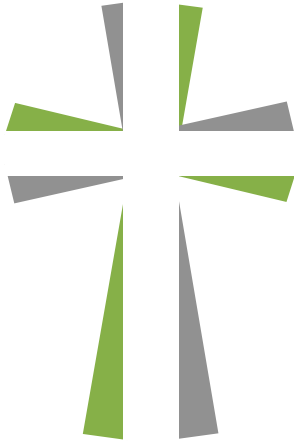

PASTOR: Our help is in the name of the LORD!

PASTOR: Let us now confess our sins together:

ALL: **Holy Father, we confess that we have sinned against you by rejecting your ways and following our own ways. Instead of trusting you as God, we want to be our own gods. And so, we have not worshiped you rightly; we have failed to honor authority; we have hated others; we have lusted after that which is not ours; we have stolen, lied, and coveted.**
