Lessons & Carols Advent Service

The Service of Lessons and Carols is an annual tradition that began at Kings' College Chapel, Cambridge. The original liturgy was devised in 1878 by E.W. Benson, but Eric Milner-White, Dean of Kings' College-Cambridge, adapted Benson's liturgy for use at Cambridge in 1918. The format continues today every Christmas Eve at Cambridge and has been adopted throughout the world for use in local congregations.

The heart of the Lessons and Carols service is the presentation of the redemptive story of Scripture. Nine passages combine to declare the wondrous story from the fall of humanity, through the promise of a Savior, to the birth of Jesus. Congregational carols and musical anthems highlight the meanings of each text with their lyrical poetry, thoughtful melodies, and artistic beauty. Where the congregation is called to listen, we have provided the lyrics for reference and prayerful meditation.

Through Lessons and Carols, we learn to embrace Advent and anticipate Christmas by telling ourselves, once again, in Word and in song, the true story of the loving purposes of God in our beautiful Messiah. Because our Messiah came as a Light to the nations, to save people from all nations, tribes, peoples, and languages (Isa. 49:6; Rev. 7:9), we will hear God's Word tonight not only in English, but also in Yoruba, Dutch, Malayalam, and Hindi. May the rich, global tradition of Lessons and Carols remind us of the historic and crosscultural nature of our Christian faith. Let us sing with countless others across time and space of our Immanuel!

# Fourth Lesson: The peace that Christ will bring is foreshown

Isaiah 11:1-9 Peter Hoffpauir

<sup>1</sup> There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. <sup>2</sup> And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. <sup>3</sup> And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, <sup>4</sup> but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. <sup>5</sup> Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins. <sup>6</sup> The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. <sup>7</sup> The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. <sup>8</sup> The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den. <sup>9</sup> They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

And the virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup> And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" <sup>29</sup> But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup> And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. <sup>31</sup>And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. <sup>32</sup> He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.
