



"Where's Jacob?" I thought as the evening service came to a close and I looked around the auditorium to see where the students in my room were. We had just finished a quick team meeting but were still missing a few students in the midst of the 3,000 plus Accelerant attendees. "Where's Jacob!?" I shouted a little louder as I began to get concerned. It was at this moment when another student informed me that he was at the altar praying for students who were not a part of our group.

As I made my way down to the altar, I saw a large group of students standing together praying for someone in the middle. The closer I got to the group I began to realize what was happening. The young boy in the middle was possessed by a demon and the group of students surrounding him were praying for his deliverance. My first instinct as a youth pastor was, "I've got to get these kids aways from this!" "Someone needs to do something!" "Are these kids mature enough for this type of spiritual warfare?"

In that moment, I was quickly convicted by the Holy Spirit. What came to mind was this statement – "Don't let your students be bolder than you are." I had a decision to make, I could snatch Jacob's hand off this young man and explain to him why I was rushing him out the door, or I could join him in interceding for the possessed young man. I placed my hand on Jacob's back and joined my faith with his, believing for a miracle. It was only a matter of moments before the young man we were praying for was delivered from this demonic oppression.

Later that night, as we returned to the hotel room, I asked Jacob about his experience. He explained to me how he had seen that young man at the altar and just felt like the Holy Spirit was leading him to pray for him. He described the experience as only a middle schooler could, stating that he had crawled through the legs of "like twenty people" and "used Jesus to cast out that demon." He was no doubt proud of what he had been a part of, but everyone in our room-including Jacobrecognized that Jesus was the true hero of that story! That night, Jacob had seen the power of God firsthand. He was forever changed!

Towards the end of the trip Jacob told me that he has felt for some time now that he is called to be a pastor and feels as if what he experienced around the altar that night was the first of many moments where he would see God's power manifested in his life. I believe him! In fact, I too have felt for some time that Jacob was a young man with a special calling. As I talked to his family upon returning from Accelerant, I shared with them how excited I was that the calling we had all known that Jacob had was starting to be revealed to him too!

Youth ministry is hard. There are plenty of ups and downs that take place in the life of a teenager, but students like Jacob and moments like the one we shared at Accelerant are why I do it! When students begin to realize that there is a greater purpose to their life and go from just learning about Jesus to being the hands and feet of Jesus, transformation happens; not just for them, but for their families, schools, and community!







Jacob's story is one of many I could share that took place over the course of our weekend at Accelerant. Stories like this would not be possible if it were not for your generosity that allows us to attend events like Accelerant and facilitate our weekly youth services in the manner that we do! If as you read this article, you felt something tugging at your heart, maybe you would even consider volunteering in Flow Students!

Here at the First Church, we have three core values—to reach the lost, love the least, and raise up next generation leaders. I believe that these three values reflect the very heart of the Father, and I am thankful that I get to on a weekly basis partner with both Him and you to raise up next generation leaders like Jacob; leaders who have been transformed by the Spirit of God, formed by the Word of God, and are now dedicating their lives to telling the world about the Son of God. #### CHRISTIANS AS TRANSFORMERS

#### HOW GOD WORKS WITH THE FAITHFUL TO MEND A FRACTURED WORLD

#### The year was 1984.

I was fifteen. A brand new cartoon had taken television by storm—"Transformers." If you're old enough, you might even be able to sing some of the lyrics to the original theme song: 'Transformers, more than meets the eye. Transformers, robots in disguise.' Forty years later, that kids' cartoon has morphed into a movie franchise that has grossed over five billion at the box office.

Transformer cartoons and movies depict a cosmic showdown between Autobots and Decepticons, two robot factions from outer space. The Autobots, the good guys, are all about protecting Earth, while the Decepticons are power-hungry troublemakers. The battle is huge and epic, with a message about choosing the right side and standing up against tyranny. Plus, robots turn into cars and jets, which is pretty cool.

In a way, we are all like Transformers. If we're honest, sometimes, we act like Autobots, and sometimes, we act like Deceptions. Know this, though: all of us are attempting to transform the world in some fashion or another.

#### SACRED AND SECULAR APPROACHES TO TRANSFORMING THE WORLD EXIST

This essay attempts to illuminate two key approaches to transforming the world. First, it will show how God reunites us with Himself through saving faith in Christ so that our hearts are ready to join Jesus in mending a fractured world for God's glory. Second, it will compare and contrast how Christianity's sacred approach to mending the world differs from secular approaches and why understanding this distinction is important.

Think of it this way—what if we had accountants, bankers, and aircraft mechanics who were not just great at their jobs but also deeply committed to their Christian faith? Picture this in every field: fantastic writers, entertainers, educators, electricians, medical personnel, and media personalities blending their professional excellence with the values of Christ's Church.

And don't forget about attorneys, law enforcement officers, business owners, military personnel, politicians, painters, and parents. Basically, for any job you can think of, the world benefits from people









who are both skilled in their field and passionate about their faith.

However, please don't mistake this for imposing the Christian religion on anyone. The Church doesn't impose ideas; it proposes ideas. We let our light shine before people so they may see our good works and glorify our heavenly Father of their own volition.

This is how Christians transform the world.

This is also why we each look different and have different skill sets. We're kind of like all those different Autobot characters. Some might operate like Optimus Prime, who morphs into the powerful iconic red and blue semi-truck. Others of us may look like Bumblebee, the sleek black and yellow Chevrolet Camaro. As Christians, we understand that God has designed each person differently to scatter us as His agents of salt and light across every sector of society to mend a fractured world (Matthew 5:13-16).



#### JESUS AND CHRISTIANITY: A SACRED APPROACH TO MENDING A FRACTURED WORLD

The 'good news' of Christianity is that creation's Creator takes the divine initiative to both reunite us with Himself and mend the world. God chose Abraham as the patriarch of a people who would serve as His particular instrument. Then, from Jacob, Abraham's grandson, comes the nation of Israel. Finally, for Christianity, this narrative goes to a whole other level when, in the fullness of time, Israel brings forth the world's Savior and Transformer.

Think of it this way: the birth of Christ the Messiah was a stealth invasion by the kingdom of heaven. Heaven invaded earth through the babe of Bethlehem, the sinless Son of God. The ancient world was familiar with invasions by kingdoms, especially forceful ones. Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian Empire, Alexander the Great and the Greek Empire, and Ceasar Augustus, who transformed Rome from a Republic to an Empire. However, unlike those kingdoms, which used command-and-control tactics, Jesus' invasion is marked with healing and love.

This is why Jesus' approach to mending a fractured world is unlike any other. He teaches his followers to expand God's kingdom on earth by praying the 'Lord's Prayer,' the 'Our Father,' which includes a powerful line: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

This is prayer in action, where humans partner with God in the present until Jesus returns to ultimately set the world right. Reread the Lord's Prayer with this fresh set of eyes. View it as your call to partner with God in filling the culture with the features that matter to heaven—like food on every table (daily bread), forgiveness in every heart (forgive us our trespasses), godly leaders in every sphere (lead us not into temptation), and deliverance from every evil (Matthew 6:9-13).

When we view the Lord's Prayer in this way, Jesus' words: "I have come that you might have life and have it more abundantly," also take on new meaning (John 10:10).

This is what led St. Irenaeus, the great second-century theologian, to express the essence of Christianity with this pithy proverb: "The glory of God is a human being fully alive!" Imagine every human being "fully alive"— spiritually and materially—by the Holy Spirit. God has envisioned and set into motion this comprehensive transformation project that mends humans and society. This is the sacred approach of the Christian faith and practice (Romans 14:17).

As a result, by the second century, the gospel of Christ's kingdom was already exploding, and its growth worldwide continues to this day.

#### MARX AND NIETZSCHE: TWO SECULAR APPROACHES TO MENDING A FRACTURED WORLD

However, in modern times, particularly in Western culture, there's been this tug-of-war between sacred and secular approaches to mending a fractured society. Take, for example, two prominent European thinkers from the 1800s, Karl Marx and Friedrich Nietzsche. Both felt like Christianity had taken its shot at mending a fractured world, but it was time for new approaches that didn't include God. Ironically, both of these men were raised in Christian homes.

#### KARL MARX

Karl Marx came from a long line of Jewish rabbis on both sides of his family. However, his father converted to Lutheranism shortly before Karl's birth. Marx wasn't a fan of Christianity's influence. He infamously called religion "the opium of the people" and believed that to set the world right, we need to tackle economic and class issues first. He thought that spiritual and moral concerns were secondary at best.

We know that economic and social mistreatment of the masses matters to God. The epic deliverance of two million Hebrews from bondage in the book of Exodus reveals His heart on the matter. We also see God's deep concern for material matters in the ministry of Jesus. For



example, he miraculously fed the five thousand (Luke 9:10-17). However, in the Church's mind, our spiritual well-being is the lynchpin that transforms the material realm. This is the principle behind Matthew 6:33, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these other things will be added unto you."

Marx inverted this order. He thought the spiritual took a back seat to the material. History has shown that this line of thinking has backfired, leading to oppressive communist systems worldwide that, to this day, still limit religious and personal freedoms. Among just one of the many atrocities of the twentieth century, humanity saw Joseph Stalin use Marxist ideology as a justification for brutal policies, resulting in the deaths of millions through famines, purges, and labor camps. Marx might have spared the world much pain if he had better appreciated his Jewish roots, Lutheran baptism, and upbringing.

#### FRIEDRICH NIETZSCHE

On the other hand, Friedrich Nietzsche has also shaken the world in ways that still impact us today. Like his contemporary Marx, Nietzsche came from a Christian family. His father was a Lutheran pastor. However, again, like Marx, he challenged the core of Christian spirituality and morals.



Nietzsche implied that traditional Christian values were losing their grip. He made the shocking assessment, "God is dead! And we have killed him!" This was his way of inferring a major cultural shift away from traditional Christianity and moral absolutes.

Nietzsche figured that with God out of the picture, humans are responsible for shaping our fate and developing values free from religious teachings. However, as with Marx, this philosophy, too, turns on itself.

Without moral absolutes, society would be on a collision course, with each person doing what is right in their own eyes. This secular approach leads to a world filled with more fracture, chaos, and anarchy, not less.

Nietzsche would have done well to remember Israel's painful history, especially in the book of Judges, that any approach to mending a fractured society apart from God is smoke and mirrors; it's an illusion at best and deceptively destructive at worst (see Judges 21:25).

As the Christian axiom has rightfully said, "The heart of the human problem is the problem of the human heart." In other words, the transformation of our societies starts with the salvation of our souls. This is why the Father has sent his Son, "to be the Savior of the world" (1 John 4:14; Romans 10:9-10; 12:1-2).

These misguided and failing secular attempts of Marx and Nietzsche at mending a fractured world, and many other philosophies like them, bring us back full circle to the sacred approach of Christianity.



THESE MISGUIDED AND FAILING SECULAR ATTEMPTS OF MARX AND NIETZSCHE AT MENDING A FRACTURED WORLD BRING US BACK FULL CIRCLE TO THE SACRED APPROACH OF CHRISTIANITY.

#### CONCLUSION: MENDING THE WORLD REQUIRES PARTNERING WITH THE WORLD'S CREATOR AND SAVIOR

The Bible has this beautiful vision in Habakkuk 2:14 of how, one day, the earth 'shall' be covered with the knowledge of God's glory as the waters cover the sea. Jesus calls you and me to join him in covering the earth with God's glory by going into 'all' the world (or every sector of society) and making disciples—disciples who lovingly transform the world as we live out his divine teachings.

#### Christians are transformers! You are a transformer!

So, think again about your job. Are you an accountant, a lawyer, an electrician, or an educator?, Maybe you're a railroad conductor? What do you feel a calling to do? Your unique skills and passions are where you're meant to influence society and continue the mending of a fractured world in the name of Jesus Christ—the ultimate Transformer.

In what practical ways can you join Jesus in transforming culture in your field of endeavor tomorrow? Could you begin praying the Lord's Prayer more regularly? Could you begin sharing how you came to a saving faith in Jesus with colleagues? How might you incorporate heaven's values into your industry?




