

Learn to Learn

Who among us doesn't enjoy the story in Judges 13 and 14 of Samson, the strong man who

slew a thousand Philistines with a donkey's jaw? Who ripped a lion's mouth apart with his bare hands? Who tore from their hinges the massive gates of Gaza, put them on his



shoulders and carried them all the way to the top of the hill across from Hebron, 60 miles away?

Samson had a problem, though, with impulse control. When he wanted something, he seldom worried about the possible consequences. It caused problems for him, his parents and others. Samson refused to learn from his mistakes, which ultimately led to his capture, blinding and death.

Like Samson, each of us has to some degree that same, stubborn tendency—even the Apostle Paul, who wrote in Romans 7:15, "I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do." We might not face the consequences Samson faced, but that doesn't mean we won't suffer in other ways. worldly self. Such desires conflict with God's desires for our life. You might not have a sex addiction or drug addiction, a hot temper or a tendency to lie or steal, but are you putting God and others first in your life? Jesus said to love God with all our heart, mind and strength, and to love our neighbor as ourself. What does that look like in your life?

The Fourth Commandment says, "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." Do you spend Sundays attending church, studying the word, worshiping and resting? Or is that the day you do your weekly shopping and chores? Are you involved in some type of ministry to others, using the spiritual gifts God has given you (Ephesians 4:11–13). Do you pray continually (1Th 5:17)?

What happens when we don't obey one or more of the above commands probably won't result in someone gouging out your eyes, but there are other consequences for not learning God's lessons. I've seen in my own life and in the lives of other Christians that refusing to learn a lesson God is trying to teach us results in having to face the same problem over and over. The couple that seldom tithes can never seem to balance their budget. The man who treats the Sabbath as just another day wonders why he's always tired and discouraged. The woman who knows she should serve in the childcare ministry but doesn't keeps feeling guilty. Lessons not learned means you have to keep retaking the course.

One of the reasons we don't learn God's lessons is because we look at our situations through eyes of flesh instead of the eyes of God. We don't tithe because we look at our overstretched budget and think that if we give ten percent to God we will only be that much farther behind. We don't treat the Sabbath as a day to rest and be refreshed in the Lord

because we think that our work is more important than what God wants. We don't serve for all kinds of reasons, none of which are valid. And so the lessons continue.

Learning God's lessons and growing in Christ involves learning to recognize when we are stepping off the path God wants us to walk, deciding in humility to return to that path, and seeking God's help in doing so. By the time Samson finally learned that lesson, he had lost his hair, strength, eyes and life.

We're blessed to have a God who loves us so much that he won't let us remain dormant in our faith, like a tree that isn't dead but won't grow. He wants us to produce fruit for his kingdom, which benefits us as much or more than it benefits others. Don't be a Samson. Learn your lessons, and you will truly know the joy of the Lord. \mathbf{+}
