Bill Killough is an ordained elder in the Global Methodist Church. He holds master's degrees from Texas Tech University and Texas Christian University, as well as an undergraduate degree from Tarleton State University. During his 30-year military career as an infantryman and chaplain, Bill spent over 32 months in combat zones, to include Kuwait and Iraq, and culminated his service as the Command Chaplain for U.S. Forces in Afghanistan. He was awarded the Bronze Star for his service in Iraq and is a Master-rated parachutist, having served more than seven years on jump status. He also served as the Pacific area Chaplain Personnel Manager responsible for chaplain assignments in Korea, Alaska and Hawaii. Bill served with various combat units, including the 75th Ranger Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division, and the 3rd Infantry Division.
