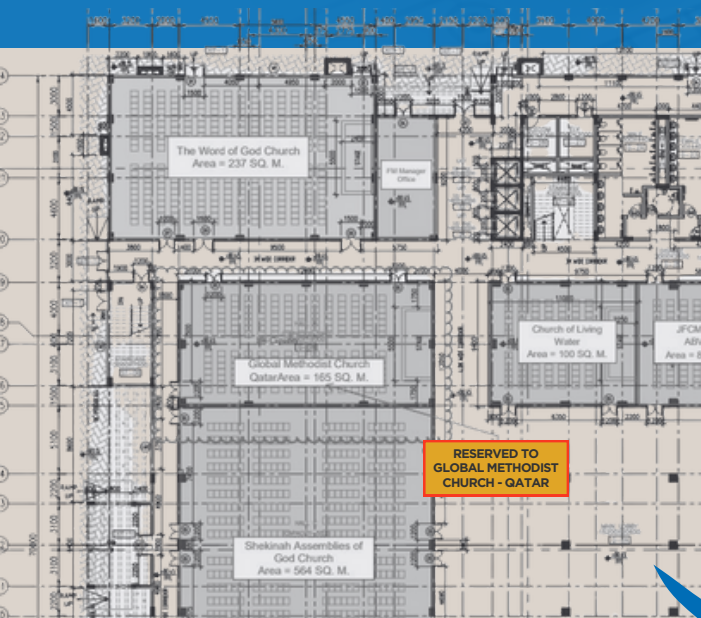

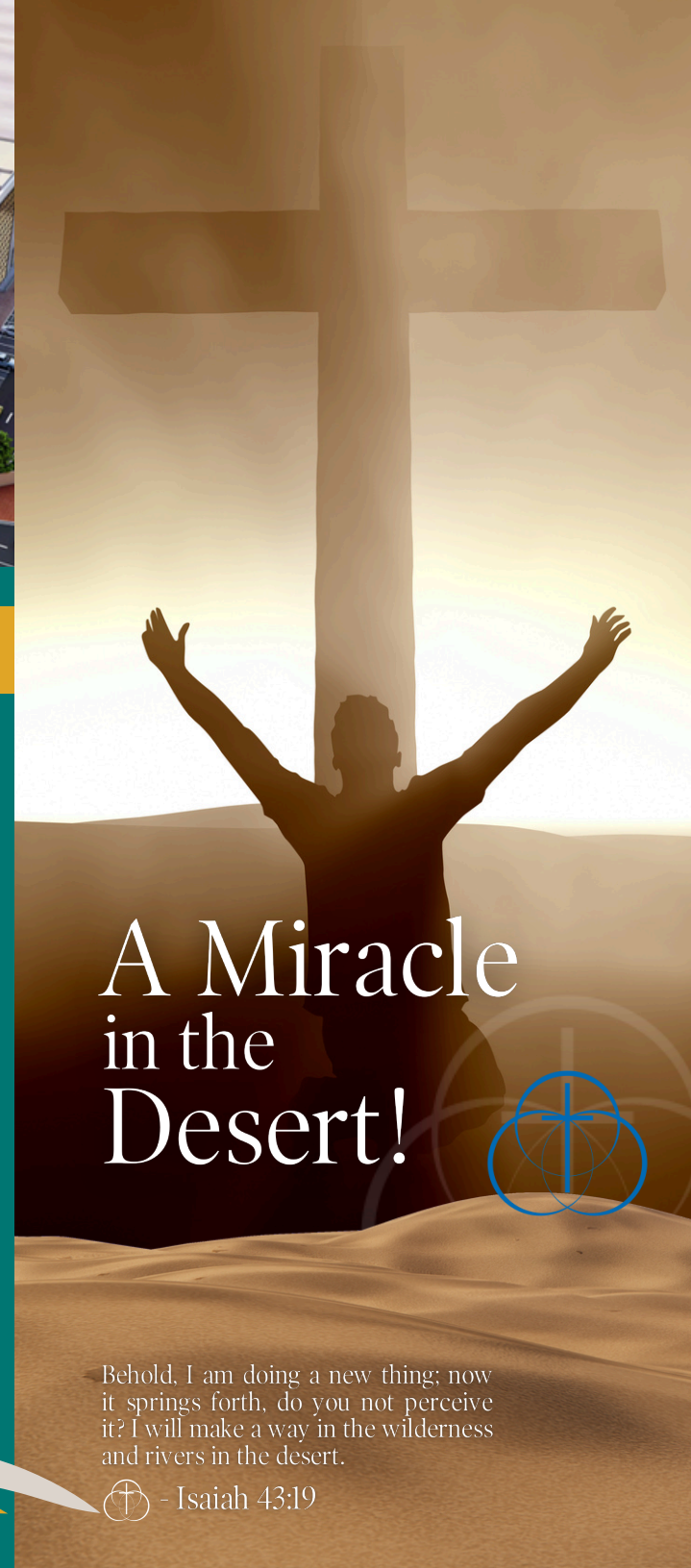

# A Growing Congregation

with a Heart for Mission

GMC Qatar has reserved a 165-square-meter space within the ECAQ Worship Center, which will accommodate up to 200 attendees. The church's members, primarily Filipino expatriates, have been gathering weekly as a house church in a rented villa in Doha's suburbs, with average attendance ranging from 50 to 70 worshippers. Despite the need for discretion due to governmental restrictions on house churches, GMC Qatar's members are unwavering in their commitment to worship and community.

The recent land grant to the ECAQ marks a significant milestone in Qatar's religious landscape. However, this progress comes with increased scrutiny and tightened restrictions on house churches. While GMC Qatar has been able to gather thus far, the uncertain environment makes it crucial to secure a safe, permanent, and legal place of worship. Reserving a space within the ECAQ Worship Center is not only a strategic move but a necessary step to protect and sustain GMC Qatar's growing ministry.

## The Global Methodist Church of Qatar (GMC Qatar)

is excited to take a bold step forward in securing a dedicated place of worship within the soon-to-be-constructed Evangelical Churches Alliance of Qatar (ECAQ) Worship Center.

This state-of-the-art, three-story facility will be built on land recently granted by the Qatari government—an unprecedented move that signifies a growing openness to Christian worship in the region.

Funding the Vision:

## A Call for Partnership

The financial requirements for securing and establishing this worship space are significant, but achievable with your partnership.

- Total Cost: 1,650,000 QAR (approx. \$452,000 USD) for 165 square meters
- Required 20% Down Payment: 330,000 QAR (approx. \$91,000 USD), due by November 30, 2024
- Remaining 80% Balance: 1,320,000 QAR (approx. \$363,000 USD), payable in monthly installments over 30 months
