# EDGEHILL

In Spring 2024, a burning desire ignited in a handful of couples' hearts. Unwilling to give up their dream of a neighborhood church for their neighbors, they prayed for God to establish a community based on the gospel of Jesus and the radical power of hospitality.

Their bold prayer was simple: that God would dignify people, inviting neighbors to imagine a new way of life through encounters with Jesus around the table.

By July 2024, this core group began meeting weekly in a home in the Edgehill neighborhood, living out their vision. By God's grace, neighbors are meeting Jesus around our tables. Strangers are becoming friends. Friends are becoming family. The story of Redeemer Fellowship is only just beginning, and we believe God is just getting started.

Ryne and Alisha Brewer both grew up in the Midwest and met in Saint Louis after college. They married in 2016 and moved to the Nashville area in 2019. Since then, their family has grown from two to five with the addition of their three beautiful boys: Knox, Easton, and Oliver.

#### RECENT STUDIES IN NASHVILLE SHED LIGHT ON NON-CHRISTIAN INDIVIDUALS:

Nashville residents carry the burdens of stress (77% vs. 61% nationally) and anxiety (68% vs. 55% nationally) more heavily than national norms.

Edgehill's story begins in the 19th century as Currey Hill, named for postmaster and Nashville mayor Robert Currey. During the Civil War, Currey HIll became a strategic site for three U.S. Army forts, including Fort Negley, built by Black refugees and formerly enslaved men. Today, Fort Negley is a Metro Park, preserving this powerful legacy in the community now known as Edgehill.

In the 20th century, Edgehill thrived as a vibrant African American neighborhood with schools, churches, and a strong local economy, where residents played a vital role in the Civil Rights Movement. A primary example of this meaningful impact is Edgehill United Methodist, who was the first church to integrate Black and White neighbors worshipping together in the entire metro area and this legacy carried over to affordable housing. The construction of Edgehill Homes in the 1930s and 1940s provided affordable housing, fostering community and belonging. Music Row, a Nashville staple, was one of the first areas that began to infringe on the community of Edgehill. Recent decades have brought significant redevelopment, influenced by nearby areas like the Gulch and institutions such as Belmont and Vanderbilt. However, gentrification has shifted the neighborhood's demographics, challenging its historic identity, and forcing many neighbors out of the neighborhood.

Edgehill remains a neighborhood of resilience, rich in history and culture, navigating the tension between honoring its past and adapting to the future.

The centrality of Edgehill to the rest of the city—Music Row, Midtown, Universities, 12South, the Gulch, and more, makes it a key neighborhood to the vitality of our community, and it's history of how a church can influence the entire city is an opportunity for us to follow.

## WHY EDGEHILL?

Edgehill is a snapshot of Nashville's larger story. Within this 1.5 square mile pocket, the city's contrasts come together—where neighbors from all walks of life share the same space, from million-dollar homes to public housing.

In the next 5 years, 3400+ units are being built. In 20 years more than 10s of thousands of people are expected to pack into the area, making it one of the most dense neighborhoods in the city. The neighborhood plans are full of retail, restaurants and residential buildings, but lacks any plans for more churches in the space to care for the ever changing landscape of the neighborhood.

Churches are getting swallowed up by development, leaving a spiritual gap in the growing neighborhood.

#### Here lies the opportunity:

we need more of the steady witness of the gospel of Jesus in our rapidly developing and demanding neighborhood.

It's a neighborhood where the beauty of diversity and the reality of brokenness meet face to face. It's a snapshot of a city brimming with talent and ambition, but also grappling with burdens that feel too heavy to carry.

#### 1. Contagious Hospitality

As a community, we extend the undeserved hospitality of Jesus that we have received, creating an infectious culture of unreasonable and unearned welcome. There is always a seat at the table for anyone, ensuring no one is excluded from the opportunity to ask questions, be known, loved, and invited to the table with Jesus. (Luke 14:12-14; Romans 15:7; Matthew 25:35-40)

#### 2. Spiritual Formation

As a community, we believe in the total transformation of individuals spiritually, emotionally, and relationally —as we grow in Christ-likeness in the context of relationships around the table focused on Jesus through spiritual disciplines. (Romans 12:1-2; 2 Corinthians 3:18; Ephesians 4:22-24)

#### 4. Creative Witness

As a community, we engage with culture through our work, art, music, storytelling, and everyday acts of creativity, allowing God to use our unique story, talents, gifts, and skills to share the gospel, tell the story of Jesus, and reflect the beauty of God's diverse kingdom in our gathered worship, community life and day-to-day lives. (Colossians 3:17; 1 Peter 4:10-11) At Redeemer Fellowship, our values shape who we are becoming as a community, with the desire to become like Jesus.



#### 5. Collective Impact

As a community, we share a commitment to live on mission together. The Kingdom of God doesn't come through one church alone, but through a collective of believers and churches using their unique gifts to see God's will done on earth as it is in heaven—right in our neighborhoods.
