9. As a believer, do you believe you are a part of a kingdom that cannot be shaken? Why is it hard to believe this is true?
10. What should our response be to being a part of this kingdom? What should it change about our lives?
11. How do these verses cause you to long for eternity?
12. Take some time to end in prayer by sharing prayer requests and praying for one another. Pray that we would be a church that trusts that our God's kingdom will not be shaken.
