Our phonics results this year showed a 20% increase on the previous years!

This term the children have been working super hard in preparation for their transition to KS2.


They have been working on being amazing writers and revising everything they have learnt this in year in maths, the children have shown what super mathematicians they are.



We have explored plants in science this term and discovered that cress seems to grow even without soil and sunlight! The children have thoroughly enjoyed carrying out this investigation.




Year 1


Cobden. The children enjoyed their time with their new teacher during our transition days. We've come to the end of a super year and the children are ready for their next chapter in Year 4!
