QUESTIONS FOR STUDY & REFLECTION:

- 1) Read John 1:1–3. What do these verses teach about the identity and nature of the Word?
- 2) Why do you think John begins his Gospel “in the beginning” rather than at Bethlehem? What is the purpose of echoing Genesis in his opening words?
- 3) It is suspected that Dorothy Sayers wrote herself into her story to rescue a character she created. How does this help you understand the magnitude of God entering His own creation in the incarnation? (Refer to John 1:14)
- 4) The incarnation means Jesus knows human weakness from the inside. What area of your life right now makes you most grateful that Christ took on real human flesh and experience?
- 5) If God moved toward us in the incarnation, what would it look like for you to “move toward” someone difficult, hurting, or spiritually distant this Christmas season? Identify one practical step.
- 6) The tabernacle was the place where God and people met. How can your home, your friendships, or your church community act as a kind of “meeting place” that shows God's presence to others?
