Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church (110 S. Fort Harrison Avenue) is located at the NW corner of Fort Harrison Avenue and Pierce Street in downtown Clearwater.

During peak traffic times, you may wish to use Myrtle Avenue and access the church by way of Pierce or Park Streets.

Parking | Accessibility

Ample free parking is available in five nearby lots:

- Directly across Fort Harrison Avenue in front of the Church (east side) with lot entrances via Pierce and Park Streets;
- Directly behind the Church (westside) entering from Pierce Street is **designated handicap parking** and **ramp access**;
- Directly behind the Church (west side) in the old City Hall Building Lot (112 S. Osceola Avenue);
- Directly southwest of the Church in the Clearwater Marine Aquarium Parking Lot (301 Pierce Street);
- Directly north of the Church in the Pinellas County Utilities Building Lot (14 S. Fort Harrison Avenue).
