

# Sacred Heart Parish, Bordon

#### Prayer, Fasting and almsgiving.

The first of the three pillars of Lent is PRAYER.

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we are told that 'prayer is a "vital and personal relationship with the living and true God" (Par. 2558).

In the next paragraph we read: 'Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God'.

Today, in the Gospel, God the Father puts it much simpler for us: 'This is my Son, the Beloved, **LISTEN TO HIM'.** 

Listening to the Lord is the goal of prayer, and we've been looking at how that is best achieved.

**Vocal Prayer:** we use words. We say set prayer (like the Hail Mary) or we read some Scripture and those words, limited though they are, begin our time of prayer.

Meditation: Then we think about the words we've read or prayed. We wonder about their deepest meaning. We imagine and we allow our thoughts to be guided by the words we have chosen to pray with.

Contemplation: Then, in our pondering, if we can be freed from distraction we get lost in prayer. We achieve an inner peace and calmness. We are still – in the presence of God.

That's prayer. That's' how we listen.



#### 12:30pm - 2:30pm EVERY FRIDAY



# Lent is different .....

# On Ash Wednesday we will hear in the First Reading:

"Sound the trumpet in Zion! Order a fast, proclaim a solemn assembly, call the people together, summon the community, assemble the elders, gather the children, even the infants at the breast.

Let the bridegroom leave his bedroom and the bride her alcove.

Between vestibule and altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, lament. Let them say: 'Spare your people, Lord".

And this sets the scene for the next 40 days and 40 nights of Lent..... So, during Lent the priests pause between the vestibule and the altar and lament 'Kyrie eleison!' Lord have mercy. Instead of standing, we all kneel and examine our conscience and we call upon the mercy of God.

There will be no 'Gloria' no 'alleluia'; no flowers in the church and the liturgical colour is violet reminding us that Lent is a time of penance, sacrifice and self-denial.

We pray and fast in the weeks of Lent and the usual parish activities will take place to support you in all your efforts and to offer ideas for things you might do during Lent:

Mon: 10am Mass followed by Bible studies.

**Tues:** Confessions at 6pm followed by Stations of the Cross at 6:15pm and then Holy Mass at 7pm. Adult formation will take place after Mass until 8:30pm.

Wed: early morning Mass at 0730am.

**Fri:** Adoration and Confessions at 11am, Stations at 11:15am and Holy Mass at Midday followed by a Lenten soup lunch.

**Sat:** Adoration and Confessions at 5pm followed by Holy Mass at 6pm.

According to the Cathecism of the Catholic Church, there are 3 types or "expressions" of prayer in the Christian life:

# VOCAL

"By words, mental or vocal, our prayer takes flesh". It is the spoken prayer, through which we translate our feelings externally. e.g. The Our Father

# TYPES OF PRAYER



#### MEDITATIVE

"Meditation is above all a quest" to discover what the Lord wants from us. It engages thought, imagination, emotion, and desire.

#### CONTEMPLATIVE

"Contemplative prayer is silence". Is the type of prayer in which we are one with Christ, it is a communion of love and a gaze of faith.

# A time to pray.....

We begin by acknowledging God. We express our desire to spend this time with Him – we offer our time to Him.

We then examine our conscience and call to mind our offences and we renew our sorrow for them.

Then we renew our gratitude for all that God provides for us.

Then we use a set prayer.

We might then read some scripture.

We imagine the scene, those mentioned and how they are feeling, what they are doing.

We ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten us, to lead and guide us, to inspire and teach us and as we do so, as we imagine and think about these things, we free ourselves from distraction. We stop our mind from wondering or racing. We sit calmly and we focus on God.

We can do this at home, but it is obviously much better to come to the church where God is really and truly present in the tabernacle (or even better, come to Adoration to see the Lord exposed).

Coming to the church (making that effort) is like a mini pilgrimage, an extra benefit!

30mins before every Mass & 5pm on Saturdays 6pm on Tuesday 11.00am on Fridays Or by appointment




#### Adoration of the Most **Blessed Sacrament:**
