The Gospel this weekend begins with the words 'on leaving the synagogue.....' picking up form where we left-off last weekend when Jesus was in the synagogue and He freed a man possessed by an unclean spirit.

The photo above is what remains today at the site of the Synagogue mentioned in the Gospel.

The synagogue was a place where the Scriptures were know Jesus taught there.

On Friday we ended the season of Christmastide with Jesus entering His temple - God coming to meet His people.

The synagogue is not the same as the temple. The temple was where sacrifice took place and rituals. The temple followed strict laws in accordance with what God asked of His people.

The temple represents for us the Sacraments, the rituals, Liturgy and Sacrifice (the Liturgy of the Eucharist) and the synagogue represents for us the Scriptures, read and explained, and we intercession, homilies and religious instruction (the Liturgy of the Word).




Parish welcome hub – Friday soups!

Lent is different

On Ash Wednesday we will hear in the First Reading:

"Sound the trumpet in Zion! Order a fast, proclaim a solemn assembly, call the people together, summon the community, assemble the elders, gather the children, even the infants at the breast.

Let the bridegroom leave his bedroom and the bride her alcove.

Between vestibule and altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, lament. Let them say: 'Spare your people, Lord".

And this sets the scene for the next 40 days and 40 nights of Lent..... So, during Lent the priests pause between the vestibule and the altar and lament 'Kyrie eleison!' Lord have mercy. Instead of standing, we all kneel and examine our conscience and we call upon the mercy of God.

There will be no 'Gloria' no 'alleluia'; no flowers in the church and the liturgical colour is violet reminding us that Lent is a time of penance, sacrifice and self-denial.

We pray and fast in the weeks of Lent and the usual parish activities will take place to support you in all your efforts and to offer ideas for things you might do during Lent:

Mon: 10am Mass followed by Bible studies.

Tues: Confessions at 6pm followed by Stations of the Cross at 6:30pm and then Holy Mass at 7pm. Adult formation will take place after Mass until 8:30pm.

Wed: early morning Mass at 0730am.

Fri: Adoration and Confessions at 11am, Stations at 11:30am and Holy Mass at Midday followed by a Lenten soup lunch.

Sat: Adoration and Confessions at 5pm followed by Holy Mass at 6pm.


