

Sacred Heart Parish, Bordon

We have been looking at the three modes or 'movements' in personal prayer recently:

- (1) Vocal prayer
- (2) Meditative Prayer
- (3) Contemplative prayer

and contemplative prayer is the goal – that's when we reach a 'state of prayer' or 'a state of being' that enables us to listen to God, to receive from Him, to know His Will for us.

Man is made up of Body, Soul and Spirit and these correspond with the three modes of prayer. The vocal prayer (using words / set prayers / Scripture) engages the **body** and senses and hopefully will lead us to imagine.

Our imagination is more than just our mind, it is a faculty of the **soul**, - along with our memory, emotion, passions, and desires - and we engage all these faculties in our meditative prayer. We move from vocal prayer to meditation with God as our focus and we desire to find Him, to hear Him, to discover more about Him. This engages the **spirit**, where we are most like God and providing we are in a State of Grace, God the Holy Spirit dwells within us since the day of our Baptism.

Our First Reading today gives us the 10 Commandments, 10 ways of staying in the state of Grace and the Gospel reminds us that Jesus knows what a man 'has in him', his spiritual life.



Lent is different

On Ash Wednesday we will hear in the First Reading:

"Sound the trumpet in Zion! Order a fast, proclaim a solemn assembly, call the people together, summon the community, assemble the elders, gather the children, even the infants at the breast.

Let the bridegroom leave his bedroom and the bride her alcove.

Between vestibule and altar let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, lament. Let them say: 'Spare your people, Lord".

And this sets the scene for the next 40 days and 40 nights of Lent..... So, during Lent the priests pause between the vestibule and the altar and lament 'Kyrie eleison!' Lord have mercy. Instead of standing, we all kneel and examine our conscience and we call upon the mercy of God.

There will be no 'Gloria' no 'alleluia'; no flowers in the church and the liturgical colour is violet reminding us that Lent is a time of penance, sacrifice and self-denial.

We pray and fast in the weeks of Lent and the usual parish activities will take place to support you in all your efforts and to offer ideas for things you might do during Lent:

Mon: 10am Mass followed by Bible studies.

Tues: Confessions at 6pm followed by Stations of the Cross at 6:15pm and then Holy Mass at 7pm. Adult formation will take place after Mass until 8:30pm.

Wed: early morning Mass at 0730am.

Fri: Adoration and Confessions at 11am, Stations at 11:15am and Holy Mass at Midday followed by a Lenten soup lunch.

Sat: Adoration and Confessions at 5pm followed by Holy Mass at 6pm.



WELCOMEHUB

The parish centre is slowly (but surely!) transforming into a 'welcome hub' a place where local people can come and feel supported and that they belong.

This week the 'morning rush coffee shop' will open from 8am until 10am providing barista style coffees to those on the go!

In time we hope to designate mornings for particular groups to meet, for example, Wednesday Mornings could be a time when a men's group meet to share a bacon roll or Thursdays might be for mothers and toddlers.

We already have a Friday soup café from 12:30pm – 2:30pm which is being incredibly well supported by parishioners, and now we'd like to begin to invite local people (who are not parishioners, but maybe lonely) to come along too.

The afternoons will be developed in April to not only a soup Friday but a curry Wednesday (open from 12:30 until 2:30pm).

We already have a 'Mind' dementia café which takes place fortnightly in the centre, and we're looking forward to Butterflies bereavement counselling services starting here after Easter too.

Swan medical group are looking to begin a drop-in clinic for those who cannot travel for medical appointments and one afternoon a week Citizens advice hope to run support sessions for local people too.

So, we have a lot to do, but it will be an incredible service to those in the local community if the Parish Centre could become a place of welcome, support and peace. Please keep this in your prayers!


