This weekend we hear the Lord say 'Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.'

Knowing about God isn't enough – God is not an academic exercise! Believing is a good start, but it still isn't enough. Faith is most important; it is faith that makes us well again.

Knowledge and wanting to know is the beginning, it is where faith begins (we cannot have faith in something we do not know) and we said last weekend that wanting to know / desiring to learn is the kind of humility we need for faith to take root and begin to grow, because acknowledging we do not know, admitting we need God to teach us is the opposite to 'entitlement' the attitude of the 9/10 lepers in the Gospel today.

Family learning from the Catechism:

The Lord praised prudence in the Gospel and Prudence is one of the Theological Virtues. The Cardinal Virtues are Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and temperance. We looked at Fortitude last week so here is the fourth, virtue, Temperance:

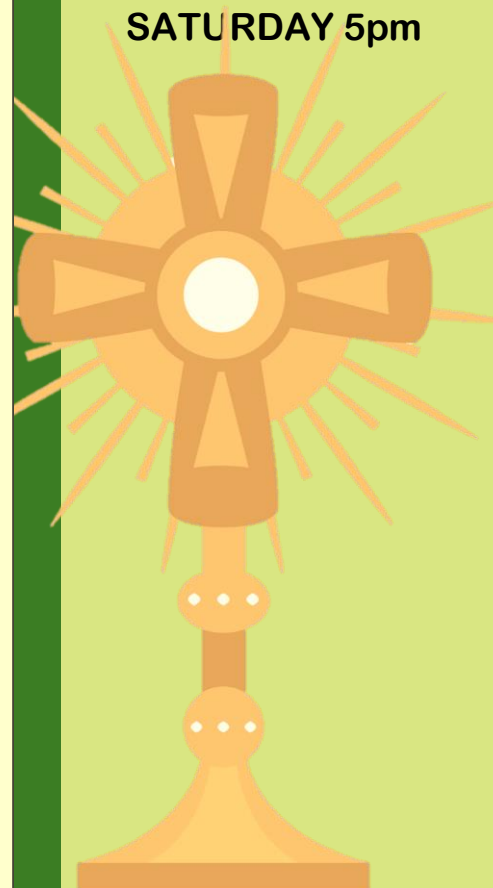
1809 Temperance is the moral virtue that moderates the attraction of pleasures and provides balance in the use of created goods. It ensures the will's mastery over instincts and keeps desires within the limits of what is honourable. The temperate person directs the sensitive appetites toward what is good and maintains a healthy discretion: "Do not follow your inclination and strength, walking according to the desires of your heart." Temperance is often praised in the Old Testament: "Do not follow your base desires, but restrain your appetites." In the New Testament it is called "moderation" or "sobriety." We ought "to live sober, upright, and godly lives in this world."
