CORPORATE CALL TO WORSHIP From Psalm 66:1-2, Rev 5:11-13

† Confession of Faith

Westminster Shorter Catechism Q. 53, 54, 55

Leader: Let us confess together how Christ rules His Kingdom. What is the third commandment?

All: The third commandment is, You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

Leader: What is required in the third commandment?

All: The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use of God's names, titles, attributes, ordinances, Word and works.

Leader: What is forbidden in the third commandment?

All: The third commandment forbids all profaning or abusing of anything by which God makes himself known.

CONFESSION OF SIN

Leader: Let us confess our sins together before the Lord:

All: Father, the psalmist sings how majestic is your name, but we confess to singing songs to our name. The psalmist ascribes to you the glory due your name, and we confess that we fail to ascribe a single prayer or praise to your name. Jesus, your Son, tells us to hallow your name, but we disrespect your name with our complaints, anger, self-righteousness, and failure to praise you. We are taught that every knee will bow at the name of Jesus, but we bow to our own happiness, comfort, and self-justification. We confess to our sin and ask you to please forgive us, in Jesus' name we pray, Amen.
