In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it.

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' ") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is the only Son, himself God, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

Worthington Resource Center (Local) Serving financially stressed families in six zip codes, the Resource Center provides food and personal care items to our neighbors in need. Because the grant money WRC receives can only be used for food, DIAPERS are always in short supply. Consider one or more of these gifts:192 size 1-2 Infant diapers for \$35; 168 size 3-4 Toddler Diapers for \$45; 900 Baby Wipes for \$20	
Romania/Ukraine (International) Ukrainians who have fled to Romanian borders are being fed and housed, under the direction of Pastor Florin, friend of the Posey's. Ukrainian soldiers fighting across the border are also being fed by these Romanian Christians. Feed a Ukrainian family for \$50; Feed a Ukrainian soldier for \$25.	
Salem Elementary (Local) Help supply Spring Break food for food-insecure children at Salem Elementary School plus other school related needs. One backpack of food for a student in need = \$30.	
Buckeye Military Moms (Local and National) Buckeye Military Moms is the local chapter of Blue Star Mothers. Our children are veterans or active duty serving in all branches of the military. Our chapter provides soldier boxes to deployed troops, provides scholarships, and supports VA activities and many other military causes. All of our efforts are grass roots designed to promote support and thanks to our military and their families.
