## Week Five

Great Events of the Bible: Moses and the Burning Bush

**Suggested Scripture: Exodus Chapter 3** 

## **Questions:**

1. When Moses heard from God, <u>Verse 6</u> says, "Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God." The Bible tells us over and over that true believers "fear God."

What does it mean to "fear God?" Is it different today than in Moses' day?

- 2. In <u>Verse 11</u>, Moses questions his ability to carry out God's plan. He says, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" What made Moses capable?
- 3. When Moses asks God who shall I say sent me, God says, in <u>Verse 14</u>, "Say this to the people of Israel: '<u>I am</u> has sent me to you.'" Why does God refer to himself as "<u>I am</u>?"
