Great Events of the Bible: The Ten Plagues

Suggested Scripture: Exodus Chapters 7–12

Questions:

1. What were the ten plagues God brought upon Pharaoh and the people of Egypt? Instead of using His power over everything to cause Pharaoh to release His people (the people of Israel), why did God bring these plagues?

2. In Verses 11:4–5, Moses describes the final plague, “Thus says the Lord: About midnight I will go out in the midst of Egypt, and every firstborn in the land of Egypt shall die, from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sits on his throne, even to the firstborn of the slave girl who is behind the handmill, and all the firstborn of the cattle.”

God saved the people of Israel from this plague. How did God save the people of Israel?

3. How does the way God saved His people then from death to how God saves us now from death differ?
