Week Three

Great Events of the Bible: The Sacrifice of Isaac

Suggested Scripture: Genesis 22:1–19

Questions:

- 1. There is no recorded hesitation between <u>Verse 2</u> where God commands and <u>Verse 3</u> where Abraham acts. What would it take for <u>you</u> to act without hesitation if God commanded of you something of this significance?
- 2. In <u>Verse 8</u>, Abraham told Isaac, "God will provide a lamb for the burnt offering" even though he knew God had commanded he offer Isaac. Do you think he lied or do you think he knew God would find a way to save Isaac?
- 3. What was the reward for Abraham's obedience?
- 4. Does God reward obedience today?
