Soroptimist International of Eel River Valley has served the greater Eel River Valley since it was chartered in January 1982. We are part of Soroptimist International of the Americas federation.

We believe that by helping women and girls they will become a strong voice for all women!

What We Do



The *Live Your Dream Award* provides women with the financial resources they need to improve their education, skills, and employment prospects.

- Many recipients have overcome enormous obstacles including poverty, domestic violence, and drug and alcohol abuse.

Ruby Award—Recognizes women who have worked to improve the lives of women and girls through their professional and/or volunteer work; named in honor of the first federation president, Ruby Lee Minar.

Violet Richardson Award—Named for the president of the first Soroptimist club, this Award honors girls who are making a difference through volunteer service. These young women donate their time and energy to causes that make the community and world a better place.

Youth Citizenship Award

This Youth Citizenship Award recognizes young women who make outstanding contributions to home, school, community, and country.

Student Teen Award for Resilience (STAR)

Is awarded to a young woman who has demonstrated resilience in high school to achieve her goal to further her education in a college, university, or vocational program

Women's Opportunity Award

This award assists women who are motivated to gain additional skills through further education or training to achieve an elevated employment status, but do not have the resources to do so. The award

can be used to offset any costs associated with efforts to attain higher education including tuition, books, supplies, childcare, or transportation costs.

K. Chapman Mental Health/Social Work Scholarship is in recognition of Kay's passion for the mental and social wellbeing of kids and family. The scholarship is open to women attending a credentialed program with the goal of completing a Master's Degree in Mental Health or Social Work

DREAM IT • BE IT • **Dream-It-Be-It** is a program that gives girls the tools they need to achieve their education and career goals, empowering them to break cycles of poverty, violence, and abuse.

Shoe Box—Shoes are purchased for school-age children who need adequate shoes to attend school. School counselors in the Eel River Valley work with SIERV to support this program and is supported by the Eel River Valley Foundation.



Book Project/Library Breakfast—

For over 35 years, library books have been donated

to elementary, middle, and high schools throughout the Eel River Valley. We honor the school librarians and their administrators at the annual Library Breakfast when the books are distributed.

Girls of the Month

Recognizes girls from Fortuna, Ferndale, and East High schools for their achievements.



Other Projects

Backpacks for Kids—Monetary support for Food for People program in Eel River Valley.

Fellowship—Monetary awards given annually to women in the last year of their doctoral program. The purpose is to affirm the importance of the recipient's work and value as an individual, and to support women who are working in fields that have great social & scientific importance.

Soroptimist Stop Trafficking—Raising awareness about the devastation of human trafficking.
