September at Lamb of God Lutheran!

If you weren't at church or could not hear it online during the service, our Council President, LaMar Grafft addressed the congregation on Sunday 9/7 as follows:

My wife and I feel blessed to be full time members here at Lamb of God Lutheran Church for the last four years. We were welcomed when we came and have been accepted into the family, probably not much different than that quirky son in law.

One thing that I particularly appreciate with our congregation is how we step up in time of need, whether it's for a \$25,000 air conditioner or 600 boxes of stuffing for Thanksgiving. I come before you today to tell you about two immediate needs. The first is a reduction in giving that the finance committee has seen, coupled with the usual summer increase in our electric bill. During July, we spent \$2,600 more than we received in offering. In August, we have been \$8,000 short. Because of our frugal nature, we had money put away for the lean months and have been able to cover our needs. I am concerned about the trend, however.

One thing that could help smooth things out is online giving. Kind of like an automatic coffee pot, with VANCO, you can set it and forget it, but still make changes when necessary. We'll be rolling out our pledge cards in the next month or so, please help us plan by filling one out. The second need is one in the foreseeable future. Ken told us last week about a candidate for our pastor position. If everything works out well and they decide that Lamb of God is the call God is sending them, a new pastor will increase our financial needs substantially. None of us wants to see Pastor Greg go, but as an interim, he didn't know he was signing up for multiple years. This candidate is fluent in both English and Spanish and has other skills that would benefit Lamb of God. All of that comes with the price of a full-time person, while we currently struggle to pay our light bill.

There are a couple of other Florida churches looking for a bilingual pastor. One of them has reserves of \$1,000,000... I wonder what a candidate would think about a prospective congregation that has less than a years' worth of expenses in reserve? They might view it as a challenge, or as too much of a challenge. We shall see.

I recognize that we can't change our giving immediately, but I think we each need to prayerfully consider what we can do to help out financially on a continual basis.

As a member of LOG, do you remember voting on this budget last Fall? You agreed the amount needed every week would be \$5,753.88. So the Jan-Aug total amount agreed to provide is \$195,631.92. However, this year giving totals have been Jan \$37,761, Feb \$21,215.19, March \$26,470.44, April \$22,868, May \$15,537, June \$21,067, July \$15,391, Aug \$18,660 = \$178,969.63

To date we are \$16,662.29 behind what we said we would give.



Breast Cancer Awareness Month

In the month of October, there are also specific dates designed to raise awareness of specific groups within the breast cancer community.

All proceeds from ticket sales will go to a local entity supporting breast cancer awareness.
