Also, there was a quilt raffle during the month. As such \$270 was gathered with a check going to the National Breast Cancer Foundation, Inc. Winners were LuAnne Cramer, Evelyn Fonseca, and Rose Marie Lampo. Since she is out of town, Rose Marie sent in a check and requested her friend receive the quilt. If you want to

As a member of LOG, do you remember voting on the budget last Fall? You agreed the amount needed every week would be \$5,753.88. So Jan-Sept should have yielded \$218,647.44. This year total income has been Jan \$37,761, Feb \$21,215, March \$26,470, April \$22,868, May \$15,537, June \$21,067, July \$15,391, Aug \$18,660, & Sep \$18,312 = \$197,281. As of October 1 we were \$21,365.81 behind what we said we would give. A special gift of \$10,000 was given on October 10 to help LOG catch up and we greatly thank the giver.

The congregation's **Annual Meeting will be held November 16** after the Bilingual service at 10am. At that meeting council members will be elected and the budget for 2026 must be approved. Following that, a Thanksgiving dinner will occur. *Please bring a side dish, as Turkey will be provided by the church.* Council has given a current request: To give your offerings and tithes as *general*, rather than *designating* to building or memorial garden or roof or air conditioning, etc. Doing that can help keep the current expenses paid on time rather than letting them lapse or having to take from savings. Please remember too, that with the call of the new pastor, additional income is required.



It's OPEN and thriving because of you.


Stop by and check out the Quackenboss jewelry donation. So far MSCB has brought in a little over \$1,000. Open between services.
