

The East Light of Epiphany *Behold, the Lamb of God*

Everything feels new as the season of Epiphany begins. A new year is before us, 2026! There is a new month, January opens like a gift in our Florida home. Soon, a new pastor! There is also a new Gospel that we will use for our liturgy and preaching. We call this lectionary year, “the year of Matthew.”



Yet the newest thing of all is not any of these. It is our Lord, Jesus Christ. Having just celebrated His birth at Christmas, we now come again to our God who meets us in the manger. We come as the three wise men once did, journeying from distant lands asking their faith-filled question to King Herod: “Where is he who has been born King of the Jews?” (Matthew 2:1). They did not yet know that Herod was jealous of the little child Jesus and feared losing his own crown to the promised “ruler of Judah.” So they spoke simply and faithfully: “We have seen His star in the East, and have come to worship him” (Matthew 2:2).

Ever since then, Jesus has been called the “Star of the East”—the Ruler of Judah and the One the whole world has awaited. Jesus has arrived! He is our Light! No other light will ever shine so brightly, and no other star will ever take his place. We do not worship the kings of this world, like Herod; we worship Jesus alone. Yet the rulers of this world do not like to be put beneath Christ. How can a little baby in a manger be the great ruler of God’s people, Israel, and the king over the whole world?

But even Herod was forced to turn to the Bible to answer the wise men's question: Where is the king of the Jews to be found? He gathered the chief priests and scribes and asked, "Where does the Bible say this great King will be born?"

Remember this: If you ever want to find the child Jesus, then you must go to where His Word is. Do not allow anyone to lead you elsewhere. There, in the Scriptures, God gives His promise through the prophet Micah (5:2):

"And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will govern my people Israel".

This promise had long been forgotten. Little Bethlehem, the city of David, seemed too small to matter. Yet the wise men went where the Word led them—and there they found our Lord, our King, the Ruler of the whole world, lying in swaddling clothes in a manger bed.

Like the Magi, believe God's word when he makes a promise to you and follow it alone. The Magi saw the star over Bethlehem, rejoiced, then went to the baby, with his mother, Mary, in complete and total faith that God's promise was true. There they "fell and worshipped him!" (Matthew 2:11).

They then poured out their gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh--the very reason we give gifts at Christmas. These wise men came from far away, with no words from God to cling to—until they heard the promise spoken through the prophet Micah. Suddenly, little Bethlehem is no longer little!

Do not be distracted by appearances—the poor mother, the manger, the lowly barn. Listen only to God's promise. There the great star is revealed: the Son of God, the Ruler of the world, given for you.

What if others in the world hate this child Jesus? What if the rulers like Herod seek to kill him? Never mind all that. Worship him as the Magi did—as the Epiphany, the One who has come down to find us and save us. He is the bright Light of the East.

God protected the wise men, sending angels to them in a dream, directing them to return home by another way, away from Herod's evil (Matthew 2:12). So it will be for you as well. Like Jesus, you will have enemies in this world who want to take your promise away. But when you come to church, we give you this Word from Christ that goes with you wherever you go.

The very next thing we hear in the Season of Epiphany, on the first Sunday after Epiphany, and in January, is the baptism of Jesus Christ. In that

baptism, the same Word that led the wise men to Jesus in Bethlehem is now spoken over Him by the Father, revealing Him as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan so that He might take our sins upon Himself and defeat them once and for all.

This means that when you come to church, God makes all things new. You will hear again what God did for you in your Baptism, with the same water and word by which Christ Himself was baptized. And if you are not baptized, we will baptize you.

In Baptism, you are given the Word of the Bible that leads to Christ, the very Word that led the magi to Christ. Hold fast to that Word, and do not be led astray by any other voice. The world, like Herod, will always try to turn hearts away from Christ's promise. But this Word was spoken over Jesus for our sake, and now, in this Epiphany season, we give it to you again:

“Whoever believes and is baptized, shall be saved!” (Mark 16:16).

That is your Epiphany Word. This is your guiding Star from the East. By this Word, you worship your Lord and bring Him gifts; your gold, frankincense, and myrrh; not to earn His favor, but in joy upon receiving the greatest gift of all: the forgiveness of sins and eternal life with the one, true King, Jesus Christ. In Him all things are made new for you, and by His Light you are led from death to life.






