

COMMUNION STATEMENT

In Light of 1 Cor. 11:23-26, Bethlehem Lutheran Church maintains the historical practice of "closed" communion in the belief that the Sacrament requires faith in Christ's words that His body and blood are truly present. Furthermore, participation in the Sacrament is a sign of our unity in the faith with all those who join us at the altar. For that reason, we ask that

those visitors desiring to commune be members in good standing of a congregation of the LCMS and speak to the pastor or an elder before the beginning of the service. Our denial of admission to those who are members of another confession is not a judgment upon their faith but a recognition that we hold to different confessions concerning God, salvation, and the Sacrament itself. Such individuals are invited to speak with the pastor following the service.




Life Thoughts from Lutherans for Life

September 14 – Holy Cross (Proper 19C) – Jesus made His cross a decidedly public proclamation, lifted up and appealing to everyone (John 12:32).

Christianity knows nothing of private convictions and personal choices. We get to speak openly, courageously, and compassionately that no other deliverance exists (Psalm 40:10), not even abortion or assisted suicide. Every human life belongs to Him alone, who has drawn all unto Himself

Sunday School



In our Fall unit, we begin our study of the New Testament, beginning with the announcement of Jesus' birth and continuing through the sending of the seventy-two. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "Silence Before a Son – John is Born." Doubting the angel's announcement of his coming son, Zechariah finds himself silenced until the boy's birth. Upon writing, "His name is John," Zechariah regains his voice and prophesies concerning his son's work. To

reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss, "God's people have been waiting a very long time for the promised Messiah. Why would they need to get ready? Shouldn't they already be ready? Do you sometimes need somebody to help you get ready? Who are the people that help us get ready for Jesus? Can you be that person for someone else? Being visited by an angel is a big deal. Most of the time, angels start their conversation with the words "Fear not." Why do you suppose that is? How would you react to seeing an angel? How does God send us His message today? Zechariah had doubts, even when an angel came directly from God. We might have doubts too, but God forgives us for Jesus' sake. Regardless of how we feel or what doubts we have, God's Word is true. His forgiveness is real. What can we do when we have doubts about God's love for us?" And don't miss out on next week's exciting lesson as we continue our Fall quarter lessons with "The Temple Testimonies – Jesus' Birth and Presentation." High School Lesson


