EPISTLE Ephesians 4:7–16

⁷But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸Therefore it says,


HOLY GOSPEL Matthew 9:9–13


C I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




September 21 – St. Matthew (Proper 20C)

- First-century tax collectors like Matthew exploited their neighbors, their own kin, for personal profit. Yet Jesus in forgiveness and

fellowship made them an illustration of how family ought to be treated (even when embryos or elderly relatives make us uncomfortable). Let us, like the repentant evangelist, proclaim how Christ crucified can release even from abortion's guilt.

Sunday School Corner



In our Fall unit, we begin our study of the New Testament, beginning with the announcement of Jesus' birth and continuing through the sending of the seventy-two. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "The Temple Testimonies: Jesus' Birth and Presentation." God fulfills His promise as Jesus is born in Bethlehem. Forty days later, in keeping with the law, the family travels to Jerusalem's temple for Mary's purification and Jesus' presentation. There, they encounter Simeon, a devout Jew whose song of praise lives

on in the Church today. Likewise, Anna, the aging prophetess, rejoices at the coming of the Savior. To reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss, "What are your favorite parts of this true narrative of Jesus' birth? Why? If you had a chance to tell this true Bible story to someone who had never heard it, what would you tell about? Christmas wasn't always celebrated with stores full of decorations and lights everywhere and giving lots of presents. Those things aren't necessarily bad, but sometimes they can get in the way of the true message of the birth of Jesus. If you had to make up new Christmas traditions, what might those be? The name Anna means "grace." How did Anna receive God's grace? How does God show His grace to us by sending His Son as a human baby? How can we show God's grace to others in our lives?" Also, parents, you can join Pastor Krieg in the adult Sunday School class. See you next week!


High School Lesson

The high school youth have begun a new study focused on the Word of God. This study will help the kids gain a better understanding of the accuracy and reliability of the text we use today as the inspired Word of God. Over the next nine lessons, the students will focus on the following:

- Jesus Christ: The Center of the Bible
- The Holy Scriptures God's Word
- The Canon God Preserves His True Word
- Understanding God's Word
- Figurative Language The Richness of Scripture
- Biblical Types, Symbols, and Poetry
- Recognizing False Teaching
- Bible Translations

Today, our high school class studied the lesson, *Biblical Types, Symbols, and Poetry*. This lesson focuses on how God's Word includes types, symbols, and poetry. These elements of literature give Scripture a richness in meaning and, like the rest of the Bible, point us to Christ Jesus, the way of salvation.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans is often called the "chief part of the New Testament." Romans clearly lays out the heart of the Christian faith: we are justified by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone. In this rich epistle, Paul teaches on sin and righteousness, law and Gospel, baptism, the struggle against the old Adam, and life lived in the

freedom of the Gospel. Whether you've been attending or have yet to join us, this is a wonderful time to dig into God's Word together and grow in our understanding of His mercy in Christ. Come and be strengthened in the faith that saves and learn how the Gospel shapes our daily lives. We look forward to studying this treasure of Scripture with you! If you could not attend today, please join us next Sunday during the Adult Bible Study hour before church, starting at 9 a.m. Now is the time to commit yourself to a deeper and more meaningful understanding of God's Word and your relationship with Him.
